IN ODISHA 2022**

**STATE ELECTION COMMISSION,
ODISHA, BHUBANESWAR**

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INTRODUCTION

The 6th General Elections to Panchayati Raj Institutions were held on time by the Commission in February, 2022.

Arrangements were made for 2,79,35,525 voters to exercise their franchise in electing 853 Zilla Parishad Members, 6794 Sarpanches, 6793 Panchayat Samiti Members and 91913 Ward Members, excluding the office of Sarpanch and 23 Ward Members of Dthinkia Gram Panchayat under Erasama Block of Jagatsinghpur District as election in the said Gram Panchayat is due only in July, 2024.

For holding 6th General Elections to PRIs, the Commission recommended to the State Government on 17.08.2020 to complete the task of re-organisation of the Gram Panchayats, Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats by December 2020. Government in PR&DW Department vide letter dated 22.01.2021 intimated the Commission that there will be no re-organisation of Gram Panchayats this time as the last re-organisation was held based on the census report of 2011.

The most contentious issue before holding the General Elections to PRIs, 2022 was the issue of limiting reservation for SC/ST/BCC to 50% as per the judgment dated 11.05.2010 passed in K. Krishnamurthy Vrs. Union of India by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. This matter was raised before Hon'ble High Court of Orissa after the judgment was delivered on 11.05.2010 by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India even before the 4th General Elections to PRIs in 2012. The same issue was raised again before the Hon'ble High Court in 2016 before the 5th General Elections to PRIs in the State.

The Commission was able to convince the Hon'ble High Court regarding the imminence of the elections, and with the interim orders of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa, the 5th General Elections to PRIs were held in 2017, but the cases were kept pending for disposal. The Hon'ble High Court of Orissa vide their judgment dated 18.04.2018 in a group of Writ Petitions dealing with the elections to PRIs as well as ULBs passed orders limiting the reservation of SC/ST/BCC to 50% except in PESA areas. Challenging the above orders of the Hon'ble High Court, the State of Odisha filed two SLPs before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. The SLPs were dismissed by the Hon'ble Apex Court on 28.09.2018. Subsequently, the State Government filed Review Petitions which were also dismissed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on 22.01.2019. The State Government made necessary amendments of the concerned Panchayat Acts on 23.09.2021. Subsequent to this amendment, the Government issued notification for Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats and prescribed guidelines for carrying out the same.

In the meantime, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the matter relating to the conduct of local body Elections in the States of Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh, vide orders dated 6.12.2021 and 17.12.2021 respectively, directed that seats shall not be reserved for BCC without satisfying the triple test. These judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India came when some matters were pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa on the reservation issue. The Hon'ble High Court of Orissa heard the matter vide W.P.(C) No.34206/2021 and five other cases and directed vide orders dated 22.12.2021 that no seats be reserved for BCC category in absence of completion of the

triple test by the authority concerned. The State Government, in obedience to the judgment of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa, carried out the reservation exercise without reserving any seats for BCC category in the General Elections to PRIs, 2022.

The Government in PR&DW Department, in pursuance of the orders dated 18.04.2018 of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa, amended the relevant provisions of the Gram Panchayat Acts limiting the reservation for SC/ST/BCC to 50%. Thereafter, the Government in PR&DW Department issued the programme for Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats. In pursuance of the orders dated 22.12.2021 of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa, the programme schedule issued on 04.10.2021 was revised and another schedule was issued on 24.12.2021. Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats were completed on 07.01.2022 by the District Collectors in respect of Gram Panchayats and Panchayat Samitis and by the State Government in respect of Zilla Parishad Members and their Presidents.

Panchayat laws laid down that Electoral Roll for Assembly Constituency for the time being in force shall be the basis for preparation of Electoral Roll for Panchayat Elections unless the State Election Commission directs otherwise. During the 6th General Elections to PRIs, this Commission, with the prior approval of the Election Commission of India, was able to get the Assembly Constituency-wise Electoral Roll Data Base in Excel format for the first time and the same was used for preparation of Electoral Roll for Panchayat Elections. Comprehensive guidelines were issued on use of Electoral Roll database in Excel format and a training programme was organized through virtual mode. This made the preparation of Electoral Roll faster and error free. As the Electoral Roll

published by the Election Commission of India in January, 2021 was the basis for preparation of Ward-wise Electoral Roll for 6th General Elections to PRIs, 2022, the Commission fixed the qualifying date as 1st November, 2021 for enrolment of new voters. For preparation of Electoral Roll, the Commission convened a meeting with the political parties on 06.11.2021 and virtual meeting with all District Collectors on 09.11.2021.

Printing of Electoral Roll was done at District level under the supervision of District Collectors and funds were placed at their disposal for the purpose. Advance intimation was sent to the Districts to finalize the printing firms much before the Electoral Roll was finally published. This was closely monitored by the State Election Commission. The printing and publication of Electoral Rolls was done smoothly and on time by the Districts.

On the recommendation of the State Election Commission, the State Government issued notification on 06.01.2022 calling upon the electorates to elect their representatives to the three-tier Panchayati Raj Institutions.

The Notification for holding General Elections to PRIs, 2022 was issued on 11.01.2022 for the entire State. Elections were held simultaneously in all 30 Districts in 5 phases. Indirect elections to the office of Naib Sarpanches were held on 11.03.2022 and the elections for the Chairman of the Panchayat Samiti and President of Zilla Parishad were held on 12.03.2022 and 13.03.2022 respectively.

Elections were conducted smoothly in the entire State, including the areas affected by the Maoist activities. Elections could not be held in Chitrakonda Block in Malkangiri

District during the Panchayat Elections, 2017 due to law and order situation. The Commission, with the active support of the State Government and District and police administration, was able to conduct the election smoothly in Chitrakonda Block this time.

The State Government made amendments to the concerned Election Rules on counting of votes. The counting of votes were taken up centrally at the Block Headquarters for the first time instead of polling stations as was being done in previous elections. Counting of Votes at Block Headquarters necessitated a massive arrangement including one Ballot Box for each booth. The number of Ballot Boxes available with the Commission were not sufficient. Hence, the Commission took steps for procurement of Ballot Boxes. Orders were placed with the OSIC, Cuttack to manufacture and procure ballot boxes. They were able to supply 16490 new Ballot Boxes. In addition, 10000 & 7000 Ballot Boxes were received on loan from State Election Commissions of Telengana and West Bengal respectively to meet the requirement. Since counting was to be done at the Block Headquarters for the first time, the Commission issued necessary instructions for identification of the Government Buildings at the Block Headquarters and the same was approved by the Commission for counting. Before issue of a comprehensive guideline on counting of votes at Block Headquarters, a Workshop was held for all the stake holders. Apart from this, the Commission shot a 20 minute duration video film of the entire counting process and this was shared with the Districts to be used as a training module. Counting was held over a period of 3 days where all the four categories of Ballot papers relating to General Elections to PRIs were counted.

With the introduction of the central counting of the votes at Block Headquarters, all the Blocks were asked to have as many strong rooms as the Zilla Parishad Zones in that Block. There was provision of CCTV inside/outside the Strong Room with Display Monitor positioned outside the Strong Room. Political Parties were allowed to guard the Strong Room 24X7 from the date of storing of polled Ballot Boxes till the counting was over.

The Panchayats Extension to the Scheduled Areas Act, 1996 came into force on the 24th December, 1996. Odisha Gram Panchayat Act, 1964, Odisha Panchayat Samiti Act, 1959 and Odisha Zilla Parishad Act, 1991 have adopted the provisions of the PESA Act. It covers 7 districts i.e. Mayurbhanj, Sundargarh, Koraput, Malkangiri, Rayagada, Nawarangpur and Kandhamal in full and Deogarh, Keonjhar, Gajapati, Kalahandi, Balasore, Sambalpur and Ganjam in part, spread over 2099 Gram Panchayats in 119 Blocks in full and 3 Blocks in part. Elections to these offices were conducted as per the provisions of Panchayat Laws in vogue in strict conformity with the PESA Act.

The Commission changed the colour of Ballot Papers and prescribed yellow for Ward Member, pink for Sarpanch, blue for Panchayat Samiti Member and white for Zilla Parishad Member. Ballot Papers were printed with watermark having Logo of SEC as a security measure. A new water mark was used during General Elections to PRIs, 2022. Ballot Papers of Ward Member, Sarpanch and Panchayat Samiti Member were despatched to all the districts by middle of January, 2022. The Ballot Papers for Zilla Parishad Members were despatched to the district by the 1st week of February, 2022.

The Commission centrally procured materials like indelible ink and different types of seals and supplied the same to the Districts on time. Instructions were issued to the Districts to procure some other election related materials at their level.

The Commission revised the ceiling on election expenses and the ceiling for Zilla Parishad Members was revised from Rs.2.00 lakh to Rs.5.00 lakh and for Sarpanch and PS Member from Rs.80,000/- to Rs.2,00,000/-. As in the past, no ceiling was fixed for Ward Members.

Results of counting of votes for Zilla Parishad Members were made available through the **PARINAAM** software developed by OCAC for the first time. Each Block was given an User Id and Password to open the portal on the day of counting and they posted the result on completion of counting in each Ward and the same was displayed in a large computer screen in the Commission's office as well as in the District headquarters. This online submission of the result was shared with the media instantly and the information could be disseminated promptly soon after counting was over throughout the State. This online submission of results was one of the biggest highlights of the entire election process during 6th General Elections to PRIs, 2022.

The 6th General Elections to PRIs, 2022 was announced on a date when COVID-19 pandemic was a big challenge. The third wave with the Omicron virus was spreading very fast. The Commission has to make arrangements for voting for more than 3 lakh candidates, one lakh officials and several lakhs members of the public to be associated during the campaigning. Representatives of many of the political parties present in the all Party meeting held on 10th January, 2022 suggested to defer the

elections on this ground. The Commission held a round of meetings with the Chief Secretary, Additional Chief Secretary, Health & F.W. and District Collectors to discuss about holding the elections in safe manner during Covid-19.

The consensus was that elections could be held safely if adequate precautions were taken. At the national level, it was seen that the Election Commission of India had announced Assembly elections around the same time in several States, including the most populous State of India, Uttar Pradesh. Therefore, the Commission decided to go ahead with the elections on schedule as required by the Constitution of India.

The Commission issued a comprehensive Covid-19 SOP for the observance by the political parties, candidates, District officials and voters. On the request of the Commission, the Government of Odisha took special permission from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India and all the election officials were administered with a precautionary booster dose even if they had not completed the mandatory period of 6 months after the 2nd dose. The Commission placed funds with the Districts to make provision for sanitization of all booths. Specific guidelines were issued for voting by COVID-19 affected patients. Fortunately, by the time the elections were held, the Covid-19 situation had improved substantially. The Commission, while announcing the schedule, had put restrictions on campaigning. Initially, only 5 persons were allowed to campaign for one candidate. No public meetings, rallies etc. were allowed. These restrictions were gradually relaxed on improvement of the COVID situation.

During the ensuing elections, physical meetings were held with the Political Parties on 06.11.2021 for preparation of Electoral Roll and on 10th January, 2022 for the conduct of elections. Due to the COVID-19 situation, physical meetings with the District Administration were avoided and all the meetings were held virtually through Video Conferencing on the OSWAN Platform.

Elections were held in 5 phases from 16th February, 2022 to 24th February, 2022 with one day gap for each day of poll. For smooth conduct of the poll, the Commission convened a virtual meeting with all District Collectors and Superintendents of Police on 15.01.2022 to review the preparedness including law and order. The Chief Secretary, Odisha, DG & IG of Police, Additional Chief Secretary, Health & FW Dept., Additional Chief Secretary, Home, Principal Secretary, PR & DW Department and other senior officers were physically present in the Commission's V.C. Room during the review.

The Model Code of Conduct came into force from 11.01.2022, i.e. the date on which election schedule was declared till completion of the direct election process, including counting, on 28.02.2022. As per the election laws, the Commission notified fresh schedule to receive nominations for the 2nd time on 25.01.2022 in those Wards/Constituencies where no nominations were filed or where all nominations were rejected,.

To ensure free and fair election, the Commission deployed 40 senior OAS Officers as Election Observers. They were asked to be present at District Headquarters during scrutiny, campaigning and also during the period of poll and counting. As many as 32 Expenditure Observers were appointed to monitor the ceiling on Election expenses of

candidates contesting for Sarpanch, Panchayat Samiti Member and Zilla Parishad Member.

The Commission ordered for re-poll in 114 Wards as against 130 Wards during Panchayat Elections, 2017 due to booth capturing, destruction/snatching of ballot boxes, wrong folding of Ballot papers, etc.

The Commission for the first time provided a Toll Free Number to receive all queries/complaints from the public as well as the Government officials. The Toll Free Number centre was located in OCAC with 5 dedicated persons to receive the queries/complaints. 1080 queries/complaints were received from the date of announcement of the election notification by the Commission till the counting was over.

A number of petitions were received from the Political Parties as well as individuals regarding violation of Model Code of Conduct. Prompt and timely action was taken by the Commission on receipt of such petitions. Reports as required were obtained from the District administration/Observers and necessary steps were taken for redressal of grievances.

One MLA was debarred from campaigning for 48 hours. One Deputy Superintendent of Police and one Principal of a College were placed under suspension. FIR was filed against the Principal. Disciplinary proceeding was initiated against one BDO. Many Government officials were placed under suspension by the District Collectors. One Senior Officer of the District was debarred from being associated with the Election process.

During the enforcement of Model Code of Conduct, a number of proposals were received in the Office of the Commission from the various Departments of the State Government, Government of India as well as other Heads of organisations seeking permission of the Commission to begin/continue with new projects. During this election, the Commission constituted a committee under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary with the Secretary of the concerned Department as Member and Principal Secretary, GA & PG Department as Member-Convenor. Proposals received through this Committee, after due scrutiny, were considered by the Commission.

Massive steps were taken by the District administration in removing the posters and banners displayed by the Government and its agencies in public places. On the instructions of the Commission, photographs of the political leaders were removed from the websites of all Government Departments.

Arrangements were made for 2,79,35,525 voters to exercise their franchise in 91913 (Booths) Wards for electing their representatives. The overall polling percentage was 78.96%.

Consequent upon amendment of the Panchayat laws during conduct of indirect elections to the office of Zilla Parishad President, the political parties were allowed to keep one authorized agent each. Each elected Member belonging to a political party had to show the vote casted to the authorized agent before putting it in the Ballot Box.

A major road accident took place in Nawarangpur District where the police vehicle met with an accident and three police personnel succumbed to their injuries on

the spot. Ex-gratia compensation as admissible was paid to their family members promptly.

During the General Election to PRIs, 2022, the following innovative and reformative steps were taken by the Commission for smooth conduct of Panchayat Elections in the State.

- Counting of votes were taken up at Block Headquarters instead of counting in booths after every phase of election as was being done in earlier elections. This resulted in less violence at the booth level compared to the past.
- Videography of counting at Block Headquarters for greater transparency.
- Electoral Rolls were prepared in Excel Format.
- Online submission of counting of votes of ZP Member on completion of counting of each Ward.
- Online submission of information in Google Sheet on daily basis right from filing of nomination till completion of election.
- Voter list in softcopy supplied to Political Parties alongwith hard copy to ensure transparency at all levels.
- All the instructions/orders/notifications were immediately uploaded on the Commission's Website for immediate information of the Field functionaries and Political Parties.
- Toll free registration of complaints.
- The '**Parinaam Portal**' was designed through OCAC, Bhubaneswar to facilitate quick and accurate dissemination of results and trends of counting.
- All Women Polling Personnel Booths were set up in Block Headquarters.
- Ramps in booths were provided to assist Persons with Disabilities. Blind and infirm voters could take the help of companions as per the provisions of the Panchayat Rules.

The Commission places on record the active cooperation received from the Political Parties, District Administration, Police Department and Electronic and Print Media for the conduct of smooth and fair poll. The Commission also expresses its sincere

thanks to the State Government for all the assistance and cooperation it received in the smooth conduct of the Election.

The compilation is expected to be useful to the Political Parties, Government Department, NGOs working in the areas of Panchayati Raj and other interested persons. We shall feel amply rewarded if the users find it helpful.

CHAPTER-1

DELIMITATION OF WARDS AND RESERVATION OF SEATS.

Any General Elections to Panchayati Raj Institutions is preceded by the following stages:

- i) Re-organization of Gram Panchayats.
- ii) Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats.
- iii) Preparation of Electoral Roll.
- iv) Conduct of Elections both direct and indirect.

For holding 6th General Elections to PRIs, the Commission recommended the State Government on 17.08.2020 to complete the task of re-organisation of the Gram Panchayat, Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats by December 2020. The Government in PR&DW Department vide their letter dated 22.01.2021 intimated the Commission that there will be no re-organisation of Gram Panchayats this time as the last re-organisation was made basing upon the census report of 2011.

Since the Government decided that there will be no re-organisation of the Gram Panchayats the next step in the election process was the Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats which is an integral part of the election process. So far as the Delimitation of Wards (Constituencies) are concerned even though there was no Delimitation of Constituencies/re-organisation of Gram Panchayats, the number of Gram Panchayats were reduced to 6794 as against 6801 Gram Panchayats during General Elections to PRIs, 2017 because of merger of seven Gram Panchayats in Urban areas in 3 Districts. Similarly, the number of Wards were reduced to 91,913 as against 92027 of 2017 for the above reason. Hence, the total number of Gram Panchayats were reduced by 7 and number of Wards were reduced by 114.

The next step in the process was the reservation of seats. Reservation of Seats has become an important issue because of the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in K. Krishnamurthy Vrs. Union of India which mandated that the reservation of seats for SC/ST/BCC can not exceed 50%.

The Hon'ble High Court of Orissa vide their judgment dated 18.04.2018 in a bunch of Writ Petitions of both the elections to PRIs as well as ULBs directed to limit the reservation of SC/ST/BCC to 50% except in PESA areas. The State Government made necessary amendments of the concerned Panchayat Acts on 23.09.2021. Subsequent to this amendment the Government issued notification for Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats and prescribed a set of guidelines for carrying out the same. These guidelines of the State Government were challenged in a bunch of Writ Petitions in the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa, in the month of November, 2021 when General Elections to PRIs was hardly 3 months away.

In the meanwhile the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the matter relating to the conduct of Panchayat Elections in the State of Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh vide orders dated 6.12.2021 and 17.12.2021 respectively directed that seats shall not be reserved for BCC without completing the triple test. The triple test includes (i) to set up a dedicated Commission to conduct contemporaneous rigorous empirical inquiry into the nature and implications of the backwardness qua local bodies, within the State; (ii) to specify the proportion of reservation required to be provisioned local body wise in light of recommendations of the Commission, so as not to fall foul of over breadth; (iii) in any case such reservation shall not exceed aggregate of 50% of the total seats reserved in favour of SCs/STs/OBCs taken together. This judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India came when the matters were pending before the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa relating to reservation issue. The Hon'ble High Court of Orissa heard the matter in a Division Bench and directed vide orders dated 22.12.2021 that no seats be reserved for BCC category in absence of completion of triple test by the authority concerned. The State Government in obedience to the judgment of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa carried out the reservation without reserving seats for BCC category in the elections to General Elections to PRIs, 2022.

The Government in PR&DW Department in pursuance of the orders dated 18.04.2018 of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa amended the relevant provisions of the Gram Panchayat Acts limiting the reservation for SC/ST/BCC to 50%. Thereafter, the Government in PR&DW Department issued programme

for Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats. In pursuance of the orders dated 22.12.2021 of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa, schedule issued on 04.10.2021 was revised and another schedule was issued and the Delimitation of Wards and Reservation of Seats were completed on 07.01.2022. Reservation of Seats for the post of Sarpanch, P.S. Member, Ward Member and Chairperson of the Blocks were finalized by the concerned District Collectors. Reservation for the office of Zilla Parishad Member as well as the President thereof was finalized by the Government in PR & DW Department.

Sub : Reservation of seats for various categories for General Elections to PRIs, 2022 in compliance to the orders of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa passed in WP(C) No. 34206 of 2021 and other five cases.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to enclose herewith a copy of the Order No. 03, dated 22-12-2021 of the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa passed in WP(C) No. 34206/2021, WP(C) No. 35365/2021, WP(C) No. 35442/2021, WP(C) No. 36479/2021, WP(C) No. 36695/2021 and WP(C) No. 37376/2021 for immediate compliance at your level. As per the orders of the Hon'ble Court, publications made on reservation of seats are to be reworked out and fresh publications are to be made taking into consideration the following in accordance with statutory provisions read with judgment dated 17-12-2021 of Hon'ble Supreme Court (copy enclosed) for holding of elections to Grama Panchayats, Panchayat Samits and Zilla Parishads in 2022.

- 1 There shall be no reservation for Backward Class of Citizens at any level (Ward Member, P.S. Member, ZP Member, Sarpanch, PS Chairperson and ZP President) during General Elections to PRIs, 2022 in view of judgement of Hon'ble Supreme Court cited above.
- 2 Reservation in respect of offices of Sarpanchs and Panchayat Samiti Chairpersons for SC and ST is to be made as provided under Section 10(5)(a) read with 10(6)(a) of the OGP Act, 1964 and Section 16(3-a) read with Section 16(3-a) (iii) of the OPS Act, 1959 respectively. However, reservation of seats of Sarpanchs and Panchayat Samiti Chairpersons for SC category @ 17.1% of total seats (6,794 GPs and 314 Panchayat Samitis) will be provided in non-scheduled areas as per details given in the statement enclosed, since all seats of chairpersons at all levels in Scheduled areas are reserved for ST category under the PESA Act, 1996. Collectors will work out further reservation in respect of offices of Sarpanchs and PS Chairpersons as provided under 10(6)(a) of the OGP Act and Section 16(3-a)(iii) of the OPS Act.

- 3 As nearly as may be, but not less than one half (including the number of seats reserved for women belonging to SC and ST) of the total number of seats to be filled by direct election in every GP, PS and ZP and seats of the offices (Sarpanch, P.S. Chairperson and ZP President) shall be reserved for women and such seats shall be allotted by rotation as provided under OGP Act, OPS Act and OZP Act and Rules thereunder.

We would, therefore, request you to make reservation of seats strictly as provided under the PRI Acts as mentioned above and ensure that all activities are completed in time as per the schedule enclosed.

22-12-2021**

Order No.

03. 1. These write petitions question the manner in which the Government of Odisha has applied the provisions in Article 243-D of the Constitution of India read with Sections 10(5) and 10(6) of the Orissa Gram Panchayat Act, 1964 ('the OGP Act') for determining the percentage in the post of Sarpanches of reservation for Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST) and Backward Classes of Citizens (BCC) in the Panchayat Elections to be held for the Panchayats, Panchayat Samitis and Zilla Parishads in 2022.

2. The State Election Commission ('SEC') and the Panchayati Raj Department of the Government of Odisha are Opposite Parties in all the petitions. These petitions were filed at a stage when the Notification announcing the schedule for the elections was yet to be published.

3. The Petitions were taken up for hearing yesterday 21st December, 2021, upon urgent mentioning, when the Court was informed that the SEC had written to the Government of Odisha proposing that the Notification for holding the aforementioned elections should be published positively by 23rd December, 2021 keeping in view that the election process had to be completed on or before 8th March, 2022. This was because the five year term of the previously elected bodies would come to an end on that date.

4. Certain developments that have taken place in the month of December, 2021 were brought to the notice of the Court in the course of the hearing of the petitions yesterday. As far as reservation for BCCs in the posts of Sarpanches is concerned, the attention of the Court was drawn to two orders of the Supreme Court of India. The first is an order dated 6th December, 2021 in SLP (C) No. 19756 of 2021 (*Rahul Ramesh Wagh v. State of Maharashtra*). The second is an order dated 17th December, 2021 of the Supreme Court of India in Miscellaneous Application Diary No. 31495 of 2021 (*Manmohan Nagar v. State of Madhya Pradesh*).

5. In *Rahul Ramesh Wagh v. State of Maharashtra (supra)*, the Supreme Court of India, after taking note of the mandatory directions contained in the judgements of the Supreme Court in *Dr. K.Krishnamurthy v. Union of India (2010) 7 SCC 202* and *Vikas Kishanrao Gawali v. State of Maharashtra (2021) 6 SCC 73*, held that the election programme in the State of Maharashtra for election to the local bodies would have to abide by the directions issued in the aforementioned decisions which make it mandatory for a 'triple test' to be fulfilled prior to making reservations for Other Backward Classes (OBC). In terms of such triple test, it was mandatory first to set up a dedicated Commission to conduct 'contemporaneous rigorous empirical inquiry into the nature and implications of backwardness qua local bodies within the State'. The second requirement was "to specify the proportion of reservation required to be provisioned local body-wise in light of the recommendations of the Commission, so as not to fall foul of overbreadth". The third requirement was that such reservation in any event should not exceed the aggregate of 50% of the total seats reserved in favour of SC, ST and OBC taken together. It was noted by the Supreme Court that in the State of Maharashtra even "the first step of collating empirical data has not been completed so far." Therefore, it was ordered that the SEC of Maharashtra "shall desist from proceeding with the election programme already notified in respect of reserved seats for OBC category only". This was despite the election program already having been announced by way of publication of a notification to that effect.

6. In the second mentioned order, *Manmohan Nagar v. State of Madhya Pradesh (supra)*, which was in the context of local body elections in the State of Madhya Pradesh, despite the elections being underway, the Supreme Court in its order dated 17th December, 2021 again stayed the election process in respect of OBC seats in all the local bodies and further mandated that such seats would be re-notified for the 'general category'.

7. The position in Odisha, as informed by Mr. Ashok Parija, learned Advocate General (AG), in respect of reservation for the BCC in posts of Sarpanches under Article 243-D (6) of the Constitution read with Section 10 (5) (c) and Section 10 (6) of the OGP Act as amended on 23rd September 2021, would be no different. Here although there is a Commission set up by the Government of Odisha in fulfillment of the first of the 'triple' tests, the second test of the Commission making recommendations specifying the percentage of reservations to be made, after collecting data, is not fulfilled as on date. Consequently, in light of the aforementioned two decisions of the Supreme Court, there can be no reservation yet provided for BCCs in the posts of Sarpanches in Odisha in the elections to be held. It is inevitable, therefore, for the Government of Odisha to re-work the draft notification for holding of elections to the Panchyats, Panchayat Samitis and Zilla Parishads in 2022.

8. Another development that has taken place, as informed by Mr. Parija, is that in view of the deliberations in the Court during the hearing of these petitions, and in a departure from what was the previous practice followed from 1997 onwards, the Government of Odisha has decided to rework the reservation in the posts of Sarpanches for SCs and STs by adopting a procedure whereby it will first complete the exercise in terms of Section 10 (5) (a) of the OGP Act [which indidentally is identically worded as the first proviso to Article 243-D (4) of the Constitution of India] before undertaking the exercise under Section 10 (6) (a) and (b) of the OGP Act.

9. In view of the above developments, Mr. Parija, learned AG makes a statement that the Government of Odisha will now come out with a fresh draft notification announcing the elections, to the aforementioned three Panchayat Raj institutions, which will be published on 27th December, 2021. The Collectors will invite objections thereto, which objections would be submitted by 3rd January, 2022. This is after accounting for the seven-day period which has to be provided for such exercise under Rule 3 (4) of the OGP Election Rules, 1965. He states that such claims/objections would be disposed of by the Collectors by 5th January, 2022 and the final list will be communicated to the SEC on 7th January, 2022. The date of issuance of the notification under Section 12 of the OGP Act read with Rule 13 of the OGP Election Rules will be 8th January, 2022.

10. The Court clarifies that it is not expressing any view on the

correctness or otherwise of the above stand of the State Government. In view of the fact that a fresh exercise is to be undertaken before the final publication of the notification in the manner indicated hereinabove, learned counsel for the Petitioners do not press for any of the reliefs prayed for at this stage and reserve their rights to file fresh petitions at a subsequent point time.

11. Mr. Buddhadev Routray, learned Senior counsel for the SEC, states that the SEC will correspondingly communicate to the State Government a fresh date for publication of the election notification.

12. The write petitions and all pending applications are disposed of .

13. An urgent certified copy of this order be issued as per Rules.

UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
ORDER

This miscellaneous application is filed in a disposed of special leave petition.

The grievance made is that as per the liberty given by this Court vide order dated 15.12.2021, the petitioners-applicants moved the High Court for urgent relief. However, the High Court opined that since the main matter is already listed in the first week of January, 2022, the entire matter can be considered at that time.

We are not going into the correctness of that submission.

The fact remains that the elections to all the local bodies in the State of Madhya Pradesh have been notified provisioning for reservation for Other Backward Classes (OBCs) category. To that extent, the election programme needs to be stayed forthwith as it is in conflict with the decision of the Constitution Bench of this Court in *K. Krishna Murthy (Dr.) & Ors. vs. Union of India and Anr.* reported in (2010) 7 SCC 202 and reiterated by three Judge Bench in *Vikas Kishanrao Gawali vs. State of Maharashtra & Ors.* reported in (2021) 6 SCC 73.

Similar situation was obtaining in State of Maharashtra in respect of which a detailed order dated

15.12.2021 has been passed by this Court in SLP(C) No 19756 of 2021 and connected cases, directing the Maharashtra State Election Commission (s) to take corrective measures forthwith. The same principle and analogy ought to apply to the State of Madhya Pradesh as well.

Accordingly, we direct the Madhya Pradesh State Election Commission to stay the election process in respect of OBCs seats only, in all the local bodies and to re-notify those seats for General Category. Further, election for General Category seats shall proceed along with other election already notified and is underway but results of all the seats (including re-notified General seats) will be declared together on the same day. In other words, the dispensation directed in respect of Maharashtra Cases would apply *proprio vigore* to the State of Madhya Pradesh as well, in respect of all the local bodies making no distinction between urban and rural local bodies.

List this miscellaneous application along with SLP(C) No. 19756 of 2021 and connected matters on 17.01.2022.

It is made clear that the pendency of this application will be no impediment for the High Court to

proceed with the hearing of the writ petitions on other issues.

Further, we have requested Mr. Tushar Mehta, learned Solicitor General to impress upon the concerned Authority to issue a communication to the respective State Election Commissions to strictly adhere to the enunciation of this Court, which is declaration of law by a three Judge Bench in *Vikas Kishanrao Gawali* (supra) to first comply with the triple test being a pre-condition, before notifying reservation of seats for other Backward Classes in the local bodies under their jurisdiction. He has graciously agreed to do the needful.

CHAPTER-2

PREPARATION OF ELECTORAL ROLL.

The Commission is vested with the authority to prepare the Electoral Roll as well as conduct of all elections. Preparation of an error free Electoral Roll is of prime importance as only those people having their names registered in the Electoral Roll specially prepared for the Panchayat Elections will be allowed to cast votes during the Elections. People even if they are otherwise eligible to cast vote but their names do not find place in the Electoral Roll prepared for the Panchayat Elections will not be allowed to cast their votes. Preparation of error free Electoral Roll for around 2.80 Crore electors was a mammoth work for the District Administration as well as the Commission.

The Commission much before issuing the schedule for preparation of Electoral Roll vide Letter No.2134 dated 26.08.2021 intimated all the Districts to select the printing firms by inviting sealed quotations. The standard printing charges was communicated to all the Districts and they were asked to invite quotations within the maximum rate prescribed. Accordingly, the Districts selected the printing firms much in advance. The State Election Commissioner conducted two rounds of meetings with all District Collectors virtually to take adequate precautionary steps to ensure that the Electoral Roll prepared is error free.

Panchayat laws laid down that Electoral Roll for Assembly Constituency for the time being in force shall be the basis for preparation of Electoral for Panchayat Elections unless the State Election Commission directs otherwise. During the last 5 General Elections to PRIs the Commission obtained the hard copies of the Electoral Roll from the office of the Chief Electoral Officer, Odisha either on payment or free of cost and the officials at the Block level prepared manuscript copy of Electoral Roll for the Panchayat Elections out of the hard copy received. During the 6th General Elections to PRIs, this Commission with the prior approval of the Election Commission of India, could be able to get the Electoral Roll Data Base in excel format from CEO, Odisha for the first time and the same was used for preparation of Electoral Roll for Panchayat

Elections, 2022. A comprehensive guideline was issued on use of Electoral Roll database in excel format and a training programme was organized through virtual mode.

As the Electoral Roll published by the Election Commission of India in January, 2021 was the basis for preparation of Wardwise Electoral Roll for 6th General Elections to PRIs, 2022, the Commission fixed the qualifying date as 1st November, 2021 for enrollment of new voters who have attained the age of 18 years by 1st November, 2021. For preparation of Electoral Roll, the Commission convened a physical meeting of the political parties on 06.11.2021. Virtual meeting was held with all District Collectors on 9.11.2021. The number of electors was increased by 18,04,069 in comparison to 2017 Panchayat Election and the total number of electors became 2,79,35,525.

The Commission vide order No.3484 dated 8.1.2021 issued a schedule for preparation of Electoral Roll alongwith procedure for preparation of Electoral Roll. Separate forms were prescribed for addition and deletion of names and objections for the inclusion of elector and opportunity was given to the electors to file appeal before the BDO against the order of the ERO.

Printing of Electoral Roll was done at District level under the supervision of District Collectors and funds were placed at their disposal for the purpose. Advance intimation was sent to the District to finalise the printing firms much before the Electoral Roll is finally published. This was closely monitored by the State Election Commission and the Districts finalized the printing firms before the date of final publication of the Electoral Roll for which the printing was done smoothly and in time.

1. Gram Panchayat - 10.03.2017
2. Panchayat Samiti - 11.03.2017
3. Zilla Parishad - 12.03.2017

Whereas, it is necessary to hold election to the Panchayati Raj Institutions before 10.03.2022, 11.03.2022 and 12.03.2022 respectively;

Whereas, the term of Dhinkia Gram Panchayat under Ersama Panchayat Samiti in the District of Jagatsinghpur shall be completed 14.07.2024 as the first meeting of the said Gram Panchayat was held in 14.07.2019;

Whereas, all Collectors have submitted the final list of Reservation of Seats for Ward Member, Sarpanch, Panchayat Samiti Member and Chairman and the Government have submitted the Reservation of Zilla Parishad Member and President except Zilla Parishad Member of Balasore District to the State Election Commission;

Whereas, it is necessary to prepare Ward-wise electoral roll of all Grama Panchayats of all Districts except Balasore for conduct of the General Elections to the 3-tiers of Panchayati Raj Institutions including Ward-wise electoral roll of Dhinkia Grama Panchayat as the electoral roll prepared under Odisha Gram Panchayat Rules shall form the final electoral roll of Panchayat Samiti and Zilla Parishad Constituency;

Whereas, the electoral roll prepared under the Odisha Grama Panchayat Election Rules including addition, deletion, revision or alteration, if any, shall be used as electoral roll for Panchayat Samiti and Zilla Parishad;

Now, therefore, the State Election Commission, in exercise of powers vested by virtue of Article 243-K of the Constitution of India read with relevant provisions of Odisha Grama Panchayat Act, 1964, Odisha Panchayat Samiti Act, 1959 and Odisha Zilla Parishad Act, 1991 and Rules framed there under directs that Ward-wise electoral roll of all Grama Panchayats of all Districts except Balasore shall be prepared in Form No.1 as per the programme in **Schedule – I** appended herewith in accordance with the procedure given in **Schedule –II** of this Order.

The Commission also directs that **01.11.2021** shall be the qualifying date for enrollment of new voters. All persons eligible to be voters by the qualifying date i.e. 01.11.2021 shall have opportunity to file claims in appropriate form prescribed in Odisha Grama Panchayat Election Rules, 1965 for inclusion of their names in the electoral roll as per rules. The Commission further directs that claims of all qualified voters shall be disposed of in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the Commission and the new names to be added to the roll shall be entered in Form No.1-A appended to this order.

Finalisation of printing firms.

Madam/ Sir,

I am directed to say that the work of printing of Electoral Rolls in required numbers shall be done under the direct supervision of the Collector as Electoral Registration Officer.

2. Sufficient time may not be available after publication of the final Electoral Roll for inviting quotations / tenders and completing the required formalities for awarding printing orders. The Commission therefore directs that as a measure of abundant caution the Collectors shall take advance action as follows:-

- I. The Electoral Roll for each Grama Panchayat is to be printed in 30 copies in 60 GSM Cream Wove paper. This shall be printed with 84 entries on first page with heading on the top and qualifying date, date of publication of Electoral Roll and page at the bottom. In the subsequent pages there shall be

96 entries with short heading at the top and qualifying date, date of publication of Electoral roll and page at the bottom.

The Electoral Roll shall be printed in Odia and each page of the Electoral Roll shall be of A-4 size.

- II. Quotations / Tenders as necessary may be floated inviting offers from local press(es)/DTP firms to undertake the printing work. One or more press(es)/DTP firms as may be expedient may be finally selected having regard to its / their reliability, printing capacity and quality of machines and past experience in successfully executing important printing works of Government. In case the work is assigned to more than one press, efforts should be made to award the work at an uniform rate. The entire printing work has to be as per instruction/date line issued by the Commission.
 - III. Before issue of the printing order, an agreement in the prescribed in Form (Annexure-I) will have to be executed and security amount of one percent of the total value in shape of cash shall be deposited by the selected press(es)/DTP firms).
 - IV. The press(es)/DTP firms shall be made responsible for cent percent accuracy of printing and asked to make its own arrangement for proof-reading. Some responsible Officers/ Staff shall also be assigned to supervise the printing work and asked to make check of proof corrections.
3. The press(es)/DTP firms) shall without fail print the name(s) of their press(es)/DTP firms) at the bottom of each page of the Electoral Roll.
 4. The rates of printing of Electoral Roll, cover page and index page and binding charges have been given in the enclosed statement (Annexure – II). The rate is applicable for one soft copy in CD, one master copy and 30 spare copies either by printing/DTP.

5. It is likely that the printing work of Electoral Roll may have to be undertaken during November 2021 and the printed Electoral Roll in requisite nos. shall be available with District by end of November 2021. Therefore, floating of Quotations / Tenders inviting offers from local press(es)/DTP firms to undertake the printing work shall be completed by **15 September,2021** and finalization of press(es)/DTP firms shall be completed by **5th October,2021** for smooth completion of printing of Electoral Roll under intimation to State Election Commission.

6. The press (es)/DTP firm(s) shall supply **one soft copy in CD, one master copy and 30 spare copies** either by printing/DTP.

7. The District shall supply one soft copy in CD for each Block to the Commission along with one set GP wise hard copy.

8. As per the guidelines of ECI the following foot note shall be printed in the final Electoral Roll.

**FORM OF AGREEMENT PRESCRIBED BY THE
STATE ELECTION COMMISSION, ODISHA.**

AN AGREEMENT made on this theday of
.....Two thousand andBETWEEN.....of
the press(es)/DTP firms at(hereinafter
referred to as the press(es)/DTP firms Contractor which expression shall unless
repugnant to the context, including his heirs, administrators, executors or assignees)
of the one part and Collector.....(hereinafter referred to as the Collector) of the
other part, whereby it is mutually agreed as follows, that is to say :-

1. The press(es)/DTP firms contractor shall at the rates specified in the annexed schedule print and supply for the use of the Collector of the district which expression shall include any other authorized by him in that behalf) such number of copies of “Electoral Rolls” as specified in the said schedule shall from time to time be required and specified upon orders delivered to the press contractor signed by the Collector.
2. The number of pages stated in the said schedule shall be deemed to represent merely the approximate quantities estimated to be required by Collector of the Districts and the Collector shall not be liable to pay any compensation to the press contractor unless the number of pages required from him falls below the number stated in the schedule by more than twenty percent. The press(es)/DTP firms contractor shall, if required by the Collector of the Districts, print and supply not more than twenty percent of the number of pages stated in the schedule in excess of such number at the rates specified in the said schedule.
3. The press(es)/DTP firms contractor shall do his own proof reading without any additional remuneration and without reference to the Collector of District and shall

be responsible for supplying correct final copies in accordance with the manuscript press copy supplied to him. If the final copies are found to contain mistakes which did not occur in the press copy supplied to the press, these may be rejected or reprinted at the cost of the press(es)/DTP firms.

4. The Collector at his discretion may authorize any Officer or officers to supervise the proof corrections, printing and binding work, in which event the Contractor shall afford required facilities to such officer(s) for performing their duties.

5. The paper of the Electoral Roll should not be inferior to 60 GSM .If and whenever the press contractor fails to deliver the printed “Electoral Rolls” to be supplied by him within the due time for delivery, the Collector shall be at liberty to deduct at the rate of two percent of the amount of the press contractor’s bill for every days’ delay beyond the said time.

6. If the final copies be rejected under clause 3 hereof, the Collector may require the press contractor to reprint the “Electoral Roll” at his own cost or may arrange to have them reprinted/DTP by another press at the cost of the press(es)/DTP firms, and may cancel the contract in respect of any work of which the manuscripts are not already in the hands of the press contractor. If in the printed “Electoral Roll “ any matter has been omitted or incorrectly entered, with reference to the press copy supplied to the press(es)/DTP firms contractor, corrected copy shall be supplied by the press and entire cost of reprint shall be borne by the press.

7. The press(es)/DTP firms contractor shall not transfer, assign or sublet this present contract or any part thereof save with the consent of the Collector.

8. The press(es)/DTP firms shall admit to the premises of his press the Collector or any other Officer authorized by him with a view to ascertain the progress of the Work

9. The press(es)/DTP firms shall not give any copy of the “Electoral Roll” or any part thereof to any person other than the Collector nor shall print any copy in excess of the number ordered by the Collector, by any officer specially authorized for purposes of this clause in writing in this behalf by the Collector. He shall not also permit any unauthorized use to be made of any of the proofs of the “Electoral Roll” by any person whatsoever.

10. The press(es)/DTP firms shall give delivery of all the copies of “Electoral Roll” along with manuscript press copies duly arranged, to the person authorized by the Collector in his office. The press contractor shall be allowed two copies as wastage.

11. It is hereby expressly agreed that in case of default on the part of the press contractor to deliver the “Electoral Roll” along with manuscript press copies duly arranged, in time and there is reasonable apprehension that he would not be able to so deliver, the Collector shall be at liberty to cancel the contract without any notice whereupon the press contractor shall be bound to return the manuscripts immediately and the Collector shall be at liberty to get the work executed elsewhere and recover the additional cost, if any incurred thereby from the press contractor .

12. The press(es)/DTP firms hereby agrees to make a deposit of 1% of the total value as security towards printing of Electoral Rolls which shall be refunded to him after the delivery of the printed rolls.

13 If in the matter of this agreement any dispute or difference arises the same shall be referred to State Election Commission, Odisha whose decision shall prevail and be final and binding on the parties.

- In the mean while the Commission has already sent Assembly Constituency-wise Electoral Roll database published in January, 2021 by the Election Commission of India in a C.D in Excel Format of your District for preparation of Wardwise Electoral Roll for the Panchayat Election.
- The Commission is going to prepare the wardwise Electoral Roll out of the data base of Election Commission of India available in Excel format for the first time for which a detailed instructions for preparation of Electoral Roll out of the database in Excel format is enclosed.
- A sample voter list for the Panchayat Election 2022 is also enclosed for your reference.
- The preparation of wardwise Electoral Roll will start once the Commission issue the schedule.
- In order to be in readiness the Commission desires that necessary orientation be given to the personnel to be engaged in the preparation of Electoral Roll as per the instructions enclosed in order to save time as well as minimize the error.

I would, therefore, request you to appreciate the importance of preparation of error free Electoral Roll and issue necessary instructions to the field officials to be acquainted with the new format of preparation of Electoral Roll for Panchayat Election, 2022.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE OF ASSEMBLY CONSTITUENCY WISE ELECTORAL ROLL DATABASE IN EXCEL FORMAT FOR PREPARATION OF WARD-WISE ELECTORAL ROLL FOR PANCHAYAT ELECTIONS, 2022.

- 1) The Assembly Constituency-wise Electoral Roll database in Excel Format for the entire District has already been sent.
- 2) The database consists of 24 columns with different headings available in Excel Format.
- 3) The existing Panchayat Electoral Roll has 6 columns namely (i) SL.No., (ii) House No., (iii) Name with Father or Husband's name, (iv) Age, (v) Gender, (vi) Part No. and Sl.No. in Assembly Electoral Roll.
- 4) The Electoral Roll to be prepared will consist of 9 columns namely (i) SL.No., (ii) House No., (iii) Name, (iv) Relationship, (v) Father or Husband's name, (vi) Age, (vii) Gender, (viii) Part No. and Sl.No. of Assembly Electoral Roll, (ix) EPIC Number.
- 5) Hence, the required information available in the Assembly Electoral Roll database are to be copied.
- 6) For the preparation of Panchayat Electoral Roll out of the Electoral Roll database of Assembly Constituency available in Excel Format the steps below be followed:
 - i. Copy the Master Excel database to a Working Folder.
 - ii. Select the Assembly Constituency relating to your Block.
 - iii. Locate the Block by scrolling down, if required.
 - iv. Assembly Constituency may have part of a Block. In that case search the concerned Assembly Constituency relating to your Block.
 - v. The Assembly Constituency Electoral Rolls are available in parts (Booths). Total Voters of one G.P may be there in 4-5 parts of Assembly Electoral Rolls.
 - vi. First locate the parts where the voters of one G.P are available.
 - vii. Some G.Ps may have full parts and in some other G.Ps voters may be in the some full parts and half part(s)
 - viii. Once the total voters of one G.P are located, keep an account of parts as well as the total voters in a separate sheet.
 - ix. Copy the voters of the G.P to the Working Folder.

- x. All the voters in one GP are supposed to be distributed into different Wards of the same GP. In order to avoid duplication and omission a working sheet shall be prepared manually to arrive at the figure that all the voters available in the GP have been included in different Wards of the same GP.
- xi. The basic information relating to the first page of the Ward wise Panchayat Electoral Roll at the top of the page has to be done manually.
- xii. Copy the relatable voters to the concerned Ward out of the voters of the G.P.
- xiii. Total voters in one ward may not be available serially in the database of Assembly Constituency Electoral Roll. There may be voters of one Ward in different Serial Nos. of the same GP.
- xiv. Copy the relatable portion of the voters of the concerned Ward from different places of the same GP.
- xv. The Ward-wise Electoral Roll is ready for preliminary draft publication.
- xvi. The Commission is likely to prescribe a qualifying date for enrollment of new voters. Those who are eligible to be included in a particular Ward, their names will appear in a separate Form namely Form No.1A and manually typed and attached to the Preliminary draft Electoral Roll which will be the Electoral Roll finally published. The Form No 1A will not have EPIC numbers in case of new voters.
- xvii. Under no circumstances the new names to be included be inserted in the draft Electoral Roll Published.
- xviii. In case the name of an elector has to be deleted from the draft Electoral Roll because of death or otherwise in that case the name of the voter has to be strike down in the middle without disturbing the Sl.No. of the Voter List prepared.
- xix. The Electoral Roll so prepared shall be kept secured/protected to avoid manipulations.

Doubts have been raised in some Districts as the House No. against many voters in the Excel Format shows 'NULL'.

On perusal of the final Assembly Electoral Roll 2021, it is seen that almost all the voters have been assigned with House No. For preparation of Electoral Roll for Panchayat Elections, all the Voters are to be assigned with a House No.

In those cases where the House No. show as 'NULL' against a voter, the finally published Assembly Electoral Roll, 2021 available at the Block Office be referred to and each voter in the Electoral Roll for Panchayat Election shall be_ assigned with House No. as available in the Assembly Electoral Roll, 2021.This shall be done only in case of voters against whom House No. is shown as 'NULL' without changing the House No. already available in the Excel Format.

I would, therefore, request you to issue necessary instructions to all the Block Development Officers to refer to the Final Assembly Electoral Roll,

2021 while allotting House No. to the voters against whom 'NULL' is shown in the Excel Format.

CHAPTER-3

COUNTING AT BLOCK HEADQUARTERS.

Before the 6th General Elections to PRIs, 2022, counting of votes was being taken up at the Polling Stations soon after the polling was over. This was being done as per the prescribed Rules. Since counting of votes was done on the day of poll and in presence of the polling agents in the booths there were instance of law and order situations. Further, Results could be ascertained unofficially because of counting at the Polling Station. Even though the official counting was being done in another day(s) at the Block Headquarters the public could know about the result unofficially by totaling the result of all the booths in a Gram Panchayat. Another issue with this system of counting was that since the result could virtually be known to the public from the first phase of voting the electoral behavior in other phases of polling was being influenced. Apart from these there were law and order situations while Polling Parties return from the Polling Stations.

This Commission soon after the 2nd General Elections were over in 2002 made correspondence with the State Government to make amendments of the prescribed Rules of counting at the Polling Stations. This issue was being vigorously followed with the State Government for necessary amendment of laws. However 5 General Election were held by counting votes at the Polling Station.

The Government in PR & DW Department vide Notification dated 18.09.2021 made necessary amendments for counting of votes in Block Headquarters instead of Polling Stations. Introduction of the central counting or counting at the Block Headquarters necessitated a massive arrangement at the Commission Level to take up the counting centrally for the 6th General Election to PRI's. Earlier the Ballot Boxes were being re-used in different phases of Polling as the counting was done at the Polling Station. Now, as the counting will be taken up centrally there was requirement of one big Ballot Box for each booth in the State. With 91913 Booths in the State and with some surplus Ballot Boxes for Sector Officers the requirement of Ballot Boxes were

92000. This Commission had purchased 33000 Ballot Boxes in the year 1996 and over the years some of the Ballot Boxes have been damaged beyond repair. The Election Commission of India had transferred their Ballot Boxes to this Commission, but the same were hardly used during the General Elections as the Ballot Boxes of the SEC was sufficient for phasewise polling. 105106 Ballot Boxes transferred by the ECI are of 3 categories namely Big, Medium and Small. The total requirement of Ballot Boxes being 92000 the Commission in advance explored various options for manufacturing of Ballot Boxes as well as getting Ballot Boxes on loan from other State Election Commissions. Orders were placed with the OSIC, Cuttack to supply 16000 Ballot Boxes. The Commission received 10000 & 7000 Ballot Boxes on loan from State Election Commission, Telengana and West Bengal respectively. As law provides that after the polling the Ballot Boxes are to be sealed, this Commission prescribed that the Ballot Boxes after being sealed will be covered in a Cloth Bag specially prepared for the purpose and the Cloth Bag will also be sealed thereafter. All the Districts were authorized to procure the required cloth bags at their level.

Since counting of votes was done at the Block Headquarters for the first time the Commission prescribed that counting will be done Zilla Parishad Constituency-wise over a period of 3 days. A comprehensive guideline was prescribed in this regard and a 20 minutes video film was shot by the Commission to be used as a Training Module for the Counting Personnel.

For counting of votes at the Block Headquarters massive arrangements were made at the Block level for preparing one Strong Room for each Zilla Parishad Constituency and necessary arrangement for smooth counting of votes. All the Districts were asked to identify the counting halls at the Block Headquarters and a Senior Officer of the District certified the suitability of the building for counting of votes. Accordingly, all the Districts submitted a list of counting centres and the same was approved by the Commission. The Strong Rooms in the Counting Centres were guarded as prescribed in Odisha Treasury Code and the Agents of the political parties were allowed to keep close watch on the entry and exit from the Strong Room. The Strong Rooms both from inside

and outside were kept under 24 X 7 CCTV surveillance. A CCTV display board was also installed for viewing by the Public.

The counting of votes at the Block Headquarters was one of the important works in the election process. The counting commenced at 8.00 AM and continued upto 11.00 PM in the night and in some Blocks it continued after midnight. Though the counting personnel worked on alternate days the BDO and their staff worked in all the three days where the number of Zilla Parishad Constituencies were 3 and more. The General Observers deputed were asked to brief regarding the problems faced during counting. It was ascertained that where sufficient space was there, the problems were minimum. The Commission took feedback from all the DPOs and they were of the opinion that counting of votes of one Zilla Parishad Constituency can be taken up in two large halls, so that the counting can be completed by 8.00 PM of the same day.

GUIDELINES FOR COUNTING OF VOTES AT THE BLOCK HEADQUARTERS IN THE ELECTIONS TO PANCHAYATI RAJ INSTITUTIONS.

GENERAL:

- Counting of votes is the most important event of the entire election process. The result of the entire election may be nullified by wrong, irregular or careless counting. Election Officer should therefore exercise great vigilance not only on actual counting of votes but also in maintenance of discipline inside the counting hall.
- The earlier practice of counting at the polling station has been done away with, with the amendment of the Panchayat Election Rules. Counting of Votes at the Block Headquarters will be done for the first time in General Elections to Panchayati Raj Institutions, 2022 for which adequate precautions and due diligence shall be exercised by the Election Officer.
- The Collector being the District Election Officer should personally supervise and monitor the counting of votes right from the selection of counting hall till the declaration of results are over.
- The instruction of the Commission in the matter of counting of votes shall be strictly followed in the interest of free and fair poll.

COUNTING CENTRE:

- The Election Officer shall identify the building where counting of votes will be done well before the announcement of the poll schedule.
- The counting hall should be spacious enough to accommodate the Election Officer and other officials required to assist him as well as the candidates and counting agents.
- The counting of votes will be done Zilla Parishad Constituency-wise. The votes polled in one Z.P. Constituency shall be counted in one big hall.
- The counting of votes will be done for a period of three days during which the votes of all the Z.P. Constituencies in a Block will be counted.
- The Election Officer has to identify the required number of counting hall(s) taking into account the number of Zilla Parishad Constituencies in the Block.
- If the number of Zilla Parishad Constituencies are more than three in any particular Block the requirement of the counting hall(s) will be more than one.

- The Election Officer will chalk out the necessary arrangement to finish the counting within three days.
- The counting centre most preferably be located in the Block Office. If adequate space is not available in the Block Office, any Government building preferably College/High school at the Block Headquarters shall be identified for the above purpose.
- Each counting hall should have sufficient space and preferably have a separate entry and exit. Counting of votes will be done at the counting centre comprising one or more counting halls. Each counting hall shall be a separate room walled on all sides preferably with separate exit and entry facility.
- Apart from the counting hall(s) there shall be separate rooms available for strong room(s), one or more rooms for storing other election materials and another Communication Room in the building identified for the purpose.
- Availability of furniture, toilet, ramp and drinking water facility shall be taken into consideration while identifying the counting centre.
- Counting of votes in temporary structure is strictly prohibited.
- Counting centre should have fire fighting arrangement with power back up.
- Proper arrangement of loud speaker should be made for dissemination of information.
- Counting of votes should be done on tables arranged in rows.
- Ideal size of one Counting Hall should be 35' X 20' assuming votes of 8 Gram Panchayat will be counted in one hall. **A model layout of the Counting Hall is enclosed for reference.**
- The number of counting tables in a counting hall should be the same as the number of Gram Panchayats coming under the Zilla Parishad Constituency and two more tables one for the Election Officer and another for the officials to assist the Election Officer shall be there.
- Sitting arrangement in long benches shall be made for the counting agents in front of each counting table.
- In each counting hall barricades should be provided for each counting table so that counting agents are prevented from handling the Ballot Boxes/ballot papers. However, the counting agents must be given all reasonable facilities to witness the whole counting process at the

counting table. This can be done by ensuring that barricades are transparent or that the space in between or above the bamboo or other materials used for the purpose for erecting barricades is adequate to permit full and unobstructed viewing of the counting process. The counting tables should be placed against the barricade of the woodlock and the wire-mesh behind which the agents of the candidates shall sit/stand. The Election Officer should ensure that agents do not get any opportunity of handling the Ballot Boxes/Ballot Papers in any manner to eliminate any chance of tampering by them.

- A 100 meter width periphery around the counting premises/centre should be demarcated as “Pedestrian zone”. No vehicles shall be allowed within this perimeter.

STRONG ROOM(S):

- There shall be one Strong Room for each Zilla Parishad Constituency for storing polled Ballot Boxes received from the Presiding Officers. Hence, the number of Strong Room(s) for a Block will be the same as the number of Zilla Parishad Constituencies in a Block.
- The Strong Room(s) shall preferably be located in the same campus/building where counting of votes will be taken up. In case the Counting Hall and the Strong Room(s) are located in different locations prior permission of the Commission shall be taken.
- Separate room(s) shall be earmarked for storing other election related materials, preferably in the same building/compound.
- The Strong Room(s) should necessarily be located in a pucca building closed from all sides except one entrance and certified by the Executive Engineer of the locality as per the Odisha Treasury Code.
- There should be uninterrupted power supply to the Strong Room(s) and the surrounding locations.
- The Strong Room(s) shall be kept under 24 hours CCTV Surveillance, one day before the receipt of the polled ballot boxes till counting of votes and declaration of result are over.
- The Election Officer should visit the campus **(upto the inner perimeter only)** everyday in the morning and evening and check the log book from the day polled Ballot Boxes are kept in the Strong Room(s) till the counting of votes and declaration of result are over.
- Adequate security arrangements shall be made outside the Strong Room(s). Two cordoned security arrangement should be made round the clock for the Strong Room(s).
- All contesting candidates should be intimated in writing to depute their representative to keep a close watch on the security arrangements of the Strong Room(s). They should be allowed to stay outside the inner

perimeter at a location which enable them to view the entry point of the Strong Room(s).

- There should be sufficient arrangement of fire extinguisher near and inside the Strong Room(s).
- A log book shall be maintained by the police personnel guarding the strong room(s) and any entry and exit shall be recorded and the officers/officials entering the Strong Room(s) shall have to sign in the Register.

COMMUNICATION ROOM

- As per instruction of the Commission a Communication Room may be set up in the Counting Centre for transmission of counting results/trends to the Commission's Office.
- For transmission of result to the Commission's office an Officer shall exclusively be earmarked for transmitting the result to the Commission. He shall be suitably instructed to transmit the result through Telephone/Fax/E-Mail to the Commission.

PLACE, DATE AND TIME OF COUNTING:

- The counting place shall be identified much in advance before the Commission issues the poll schedule and the list of the Counting Halls shall be intimated to the Commission with relevant information of counting centre by the dateline asked for.
- The contesting candidates shall be informed in writing about the commencement of the counting, date, time and place 72 hours before the time fixed for counting.
- Since, it is decided that there shall be one table for one GP the contesting candidates for the office of Ward Member may be intimated separate times for them or their agents arrival taking into consideration the Serial No. of the Ward. This may be done to avoid unnecessary rush at the counting hall and centre.

APPOINTMENT OF ELECTION OFFICER FOR COUNTING:

- Ordinarily the Block Development Officer is the Election Officer for the purpose of counting of votes and declaration of result. There are some Blocks where counting of votes will be required to be taken up in two halls on the same day of counting. In that event another OAS Officer in the rank of BDO may be appointed by the District Collector to assist the Election Officer on counting of votes.

- In such Blocks the local BDO will function as Election Officer in one counting hall and other OAS Officer will assist the Election Officer in counting in the 2nd hall. The Officer in the 2nd hall will discharge all the functions of Election Officer but the statutory work like Declaration of Result will be done under the signature of the B.D.O-Cum-Election Officer of the Block.

APPOINTMENT OF COUNTING PERSONNEL:

- The Election Officer shall appoint the following personnel for each counting table.
 - i) Counting Supervisor- 1
 - ii) Counting Assistant- 2
 - iii) Group 'D' employee- 1
- The Polling personnel who have been appointed for conducting the poll should not ordinarily be engaged for counting.
- In case it is absolutely essential in any particular Block, the Election Officer can appoint Polling Personnel as counting personnel with the approval of the Collector of the District.
- The counting personnel shall not be engaged for three days continuously. They shall be engaged on alternate days if the counting is spread over all three days in a Block.
- The number of counting teams should be the same as the number of Gram Panchayats coming under one Z.P. Constituency.
- 1-2 team(s) may be kept as reserve Counting Team(s).
- The teams shall be numbered serially (1, 2, 3,)
- One hour before the time fixed for counting the Election Officer shall draw lots to decide which team will be assigned to which table.
- This means the team whose lot is drawn first shall go to the Table No.1 and whose lot is drawn 2nd will go to Table No.2 and in similar manner till end of draw of lots.
- The Counting Supervisor shall necessarily be higher in grade as well as the pay scale to the Counting Assistant.
- The Counting Personnel will be paid remuneration at the rate prescribed by the Commission.
- Every Counting personnel may be issued with a Pass in the following format. They will remain seated in their respective Tables allotted till the completion of the counting and not roam inside the Hall or go to another table.

- 5% of the total Counting Personnel may be kept as reserve as a stand by arrangement.

TRAINING OF COUNTING PERSONNEL

- Counting personnel shall be given one round intensive hands on training on counting of votes as well as filling up of different kinds of forms during the counting process.
- Similarly, the personnel in-charge of the Strong Room, sealing room and other rooms shall also be properly trained in order to avoid any future mistakes.
- A physical demonstration of the counting of votes including transportation of Ballot Boxes from the Strong Room to the counting table, opening of ballot boxes, demonstration to the counting agents, actual counting of votes, filling up of forms, preparation of broad sheet, sealing of votes as well as other materials after counting is over shall be properly demonstrated during training.
- The counting personnel shall also be asked to demonstrate themselves about the training imparted so that any error by the counting personnel can be minimized.

APPOINTMENT OF COUNTING AGENT:

- Each candidate is allowed to appoint one counting agent in each table. Since it is decided that counting of votes will be taken up G.P.wise, those contesting for the office of Ward Member, Sarpanch and Panchayat Samiti Member they are allowed to appoint one person as their counting agent for each post.
- Those contesting to the office of Zilla Parishad Member can appoint as many Counting Agents as the number of G.Ps in that particular Zilla Parishad Constituency.
- Apart from this all contesting candidates can appoint one more counting agent for the Election Officer's Table.
- In case the candidate is present in person, he/she can perform the duty of the counting agent.
- The contesting candidates shall apply for appointment of Counting Agent in the prescribed Format to the Election Officer at least 72 hours before the time fixed for counting alongwith Passport size photographs in duplicate of the person to be appointed as Counting Agent .
- The candidate has to specify the Ward /Gram Panchayat for himself/ agent to be assigned. Those allowed inside the counting hall shall report 15 minutes before the actual time for counting.

COMMENCEMENT OF COUNTING:

- The counting of votes shall be taken up at the time and date as specified by the Election Commission.
- All those authorized to be present inside the counting hall shall be present 15 minutes before the actual time for counting.
- Entire proceedings shall be videographed with proper date/time stamping.
- Everyone present in the counting hall should be instructed to maintain secrecy of vote. For that purpose the provisions of Section 128 of the Representation of Peoples Act, 1951 should be brought to the notice of everyone by reading that Section aloud.
- Section 128 of the Representation of Peoples Act,1951 is as follows:

“128. Maintenance of secrecy of voting. – (1) Every officer, clerk, agent or other person who performs any duty in connection with the recording or counting of votes at an election shall maintain, and aid in maintaining,

the secrecy of the voting and shall not (except for some purpose authorized by or under any law) communicate to any person any information calculated to violate such secrecy.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of sub-section (1) shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three months or with fine or with both.

SECURITY ARRANGEMENT DURING COUNTING:

- Adequate security arrangements shall be made outside the Counting Hall as well as outside the Counting Centre.
- The security personnel will allow the candidates or their Counting Agents, Counting Personnel and person with Duty Pass having ID card issued by the Election Officer to the Counting Centre.
- Entry of the unauthorized persons into the Counting Centre shall be strictly prohibited.
- No mobile phone/tablet/Lap-top, or any such electronic device which can record audio or video are allowed in the Counting Hall. Proper arrangement shall be made at the Counting Centre for safe keeping of the mobiles of Counting Staff/Candidates/Counting Agents, if any.
- Smoking inside the Counting Hall is strictly prohibited.
- No person should leave the Counting Hall or enter the Counting Hall without prior permission of the Election Officer.

PERSONS ALLOWED INSIDE THE COUNTING HALL

- Only the following persons are allowed inside the Counting Hall.
 - (i) Election Officer, Counting Supervisor & Counting Assistants.
 - (ii) Persons authorized by the State Election Commission.
 - (iii) Public servants on duty in connection with the election (with Duty Pass).
 - (iv) Candidates or their Counting Agents.
- Election Officer should note that expression of “public servant on duty in connection with election” does not include police officers; such officers whether in uniform or in plain clothes should not, as a general rule, be allowed to enter inside the counting hall without any exception, unless Election Officer decide to call them in for the maintenance of law and order or some similar purpose. Their presence in the counting hall without any compelling reason has on occasion given rise to complaints

by some candidates or parties that their agents have been overawed by an unnecessary show of force.

- Election Officer should also note that the above expression “public servant on duty in connection with election” does not include the Ministers/State Ministers/Deputy Ministers of the Union Govt. or State Govt. They can come inside the counting hall only as candidate. They can’t be allowed to be appointed as counting agents as they have to be escorted by their security guards who are not be allowed entry into the counting hall. The Commission, has further clarified that even if they voluntarily decide to relinquish their security, they will not be allowed to become counting agent.

COUNTING MATERIALS:

- Generally, the following stationery would be required for one counting table.
 1. Knife for cutting and opening the seals, etc.
 2. Pencil/Ball Point Pen.
 3. Four sheets of plain paper
 4. Paper Weight
 5. Tray as per number of Candidates
 6. Rubber Band
 7. Water sponge
- All these above materials should be provided to the individual Counting Table before starting of the Counting.

TRANSPORTATION OF BALLOT BOXES:

- Normally the Strong Room(s) and counting hall shall be located in one building. If polled Ballot Boxes are stored in a place other than the Counting Centre, then proper security arrangement should be made while transporting Ballot Boxes from the Strong Room(s) to the Counting Centre.
- Polled Ballot Boxes stored in the Strong Room(s) shall have to be taken to the counting table and after the counting of the votes are over the polled votes shall be handed over to the sealing room and blank boxes he kept separately.
- The movement of polled Ballot Boxes from the Strong Room(s) to the counting table is most important and vital work for which trained personnel shall be deployed at the Strong Room(s) as well as in the entrance of the counting hall so that the Group ‘D’ staff handling the Ballot Boxes do not commit any mistake.
- A register has to be maintained at the Strong Room(s) as well as just at the entrance of the counting hall to avoid any mistake.

COUNTING OF VOTES:

- The counting of votes shall commence on the day and at the place and time fixed by the Commission under the supervision of Election Officer in the presence of the Candidates and their Counting Agents.
- Counting of votes should be continuous.
- In the extraordinary situation if the counting could not be completed before 8.00 AM of the next day the counting will continue till it is completed. The counting for the next Zilla Parishad Constituency can only commence only when the previous one is completed even though the time mandated is 8.00 AM.
- During the entire counting process complete discipline and decorum shall be maintained.
- The Election Officer has authority to ask anybody to go out of the counting centre if he disobeys any rightful direction of the Election Officer.
- Counting of votes shall be taken up as per the sequence of the Z P Constituency in a Block. It means the Z.P. Constituency coming first in Serial No. Shall be taken up for counting on the 1st day of counting. The counting on subsequent days shall be taken up sequentially.
- In Blocks where there is only 1 Z.P. Constituency the counting of votes in the said Blocks will be completed on the first day of counting in one hall.
- In Blocks where there are 2 Z.P. Constituencies the same shall be completed within first two days of counting in one hall each day.
- In Blocks where there are 3 Z.P. Constituencies one Z.P. constituency will be counted on each day of three day counting in one hall.
- In Blocks where there are more than 3 Z.P. Constituencies, the counting of votes shall be taken up in two separate halls.
- In Blocks where there are 4 Z.P. Constituencies, counting of votes in the 1st Z.P. Constituency will be taken up on the first day of counting followed by second one in the second day of counting and 3rd and 4th on the third day of counting.
- In Blocks where there are 5 Z.P. Constituencies, the counting of votes in the 1st Z.P. Constituency shall be taken up on the first day of counting and followed up 2nd and 3rd Z.P. Constituencies on the 2nd day and 4th and 5th constituencies on the third day of the counting.
- In Blocks where there are 6 Z.P. Constituencies, the counting of votes will be taken up for 2 Z.P. Constituencies on each day of counting.

COUNTING TABLE:

- There shall be one counting table for one GP and the number of tables for the purpose of counting would be the same as the number of GPs coming within the Z.P. Constituency. Apart from this there shall be a separate table for the Election Officer and another table for the officials engaged in tabulation work. All the counting tables shall be numbered and a register shall be maintained showing distribution of Ballot boxes to the Counting Table.
- Provided that there may be some Gram Panchayats having more number of Wards say 24-25. In that event the counting process will be held up till the counting of all the Wards are completed. In such a situation the Collector may make an assessment and if felt necessary the total votes polled in one GP can be counted in two Tables ward-wise (*one Table with Wards having odd number and other with even number*) with prior approval of the Collector subject to the availability of the space and other logistic arrangement.
- The number of tables for the purpose of counting of votes in one hall shall be equal to the maximum of the number of the Gram Panchayats coming under the Zilla Parishad Constituencies.
- This means if a Block has got three Z.P. Constituencies and the number of Gram Panchayats coming under these Z.P. Constituencies are 6, 8 & 10, then 10 tables shall be arranged for counting of votes.
- As per the earlier instruction the Sl.No. of the Z.P. Constituency appearing first for the Block shall be counted on the first day of counting. But, the counting hall should be prepared for the maximum Gram Panchayats even though the counting may be on the 3rd day.
- **ILLUSTRATION:** There are 3 Zilla Parishad Constituencies in a Block. On the 1st day counting the Z.P. Constituency 1 will be taken up where there are 8 Gram Panchayats. On the 2nd day of counting there are 6 Gram Panchayats coming under the 2nd Z.P. Constituency and on the 3rd day the counting for the 3rd Z.P. Constituency there are 10 GPs. In this event while finalizing the counting hall and preparing the same there should be 10 tables for counting of votes by the counting personnel. Some tables may remain idle in the 1st day and 2nd day of counting.

DISTRIBUTION OF BALLOT BOXES TO THE COUNTING TABLE:

- The polled Ballot Boxes shall be taken to the Counting Hall 15 minutes before the time fixed for counting.
- As counting will be done Zilla Parishad Constituency-wise, Gram Panchayats under the concerned Zilla Parishad Constituency shall be arranged in odia alphabetically. Distribution of Ballot Boxes to the Counting Tables shall be done in the serial order of the Gram Panchayat i.e. counting of Gram Panchayat placed at Serial No.1 shall be done at Counting Table No.1 and counting of Gram Panchayat placed at Serial No.2 shall be done at Counting Table No2.

Illustration – Suppose one Zilla Parishad Constituency has 8 Gram Panchayats. There shall be 8 Counting Tables. Counting of Gram Panchayat placed at Sl.No.1 shall be done at Counting Table No.1 and counting of Gram Panchayat placed at Sl.No.2 shall be done at Counting Table No2.For other Tables in similar manner.

- A register shall be maintained showing which Ballot Box is allotted to which Counting Table. The official in charge of strong room shall hand over the Ballot Box to the Group –D counting staff of the concerned Counting Table and after counting of votes of the concerned Ballot Box, the Counting Supervisor shall return the same through Group D staff to the Sealing Room.

COUNTING OF VOTES ON THE COUNTING TABLE:

- When the Ballot Box(es) is brought to the Counting Table, the Address Tag put thereon by the Presiding Officer at the Polling Station specifying the name of Gram Panchayat, Ward No. etc. should be verified to ascertain that the Ballot Box(es) is for the Table allotted.
- Before counting, Counting Supervisor shall satisfy himself that the Ballot Box(es) has not been tampered with.
- After Counting Supervisor is satisfied that the Ballot Box(es) is intact and not been tampered with, them counting shall be done by the Counting Assistants. If it is found that the Ballot Box(es) has been tampered with, the same should be kept aside and should not be counted. The matter should be reported to the Election Officer, who in turn will seek clarification from the Commission.
- Before counting, the Candidates or their Counting Agent present at the counting table shall be allowed to inspect the seal fixed by the Presiding Officer on the Ballot Box(es).

- The Seal of the Ballot Box(es) shall be removed in presence of Counting Supervisor.
- In the Ballot Box(es) there would be 4 ballot papers in different colours for Ward Member, Sarpanch, Panchayat Samiti Member and Zilla Parishad Member. The different varieties of ballot papers shall be segregated and be bundled in rubber band.
- Counting of votes in the Ballot Box(es) relating to the Membership of the Ward (Ward Member) shall be taken up first.
- A tray for each symbol and another for invalid ballot paper shall be kept and all ballot papers shall be segregated symbol wise and placed in the concerned tray.
- After segregation the ballot papers shall be counted and each Ballot Paper shall be carefully scrutinized by the Counting Assistant in the course of counting and a ballot paper shall be liable to rejection on one or more of the following grounds, namely:-
 - (a) If it bears any mark or writing by which the voter can be identified,
 - (b) If no vote is recorded thereon,
 - (c) If votes are recorded in favour of more than one candidate,
 - (d) If the mark indicating the votes is placed in such a manner so as to make it doubtful as to which candidate the votes has been given.
 - (e) If the ballot paper is spurious,
 - (f) If it is so damaged or mutilated that its genuineness can not be established,
 - (g) If it is of a design different from the one authorized for use at the polling station,
 - (h) If it does not bear the seal and signature of the Presiding Officer
- The counting Supervisor shall summarily decide at the time of scrutiny and in case of rejection shall endorse under his signature on the ballot paper itself. He shall also record the reason for each Ballot Paper so rejected in a separate paper.

- The total number of votes including invalid votes should tally with total number of votes polled in the concerned Ward for Ward-Member as reported by the Presiding Officer. After counting, the Counting Supervisor shall write down votes polled separately in respect of each Member in Form No.8 in case of Ward Member and announce the votes polled by each candidate and send this Form to the Election Officer. The Counting Assistant shall next proceed to count the Ballot Paper relating to the office of Sarpanch and then Panchayat Samiti Member and Zilla Parishad Member. After completion of counting the Counting Supervisor shall write down such votes polled separately in respect of each candidate in Form No.8A in case of Sarpanch, in Form No.13 in case of Panchayati Samiti Member and in Form No.11-A in case of Zilla Parishad Member and announce the votes polled by each contesting candidate and send these Forms to the Election Officer.

- After completion of counting of each ward, the Counting supervisor will send the result of counting to the Officer in charge of broad sheet for compilation.

- Broad sheet for recording the results of Wards for Sarpanch and Panchayat Samiti Member shall be maintained. Result of Sarpanch, and Panchayat Samiti Member is to be derived by correct totaling of votes secured by Candidates in different Wards arithmetically and then announced by the Election Officer.

- Two Broad sheets shall be maintained for recording the results of Zilla Parishad Member. One Broad Sheet for correct totaling of votes of secured by Candidates in different Wards within a Gram Panchayat of concerned Zilla Parishad constituency arithmetically. Second Broad Sheet for correct totaling of votes of secured by Candidates in different Gram Panchayats within the concerned Zilla Parishad constituency arithmetically. Result of Zilla Parishad Member to be derived by correct totaling of votes secured by Candidates in different Gram Panchayats of concerned Zilla Parishad constituency arithmetically and then announced by the Election Officer.

- The candidate securing the largest number of votes shall be declared duly elected. In the case of an equality of votes, the result shall be decided by drawing lots and the candidate whose name is drawn first shall be declared elected.

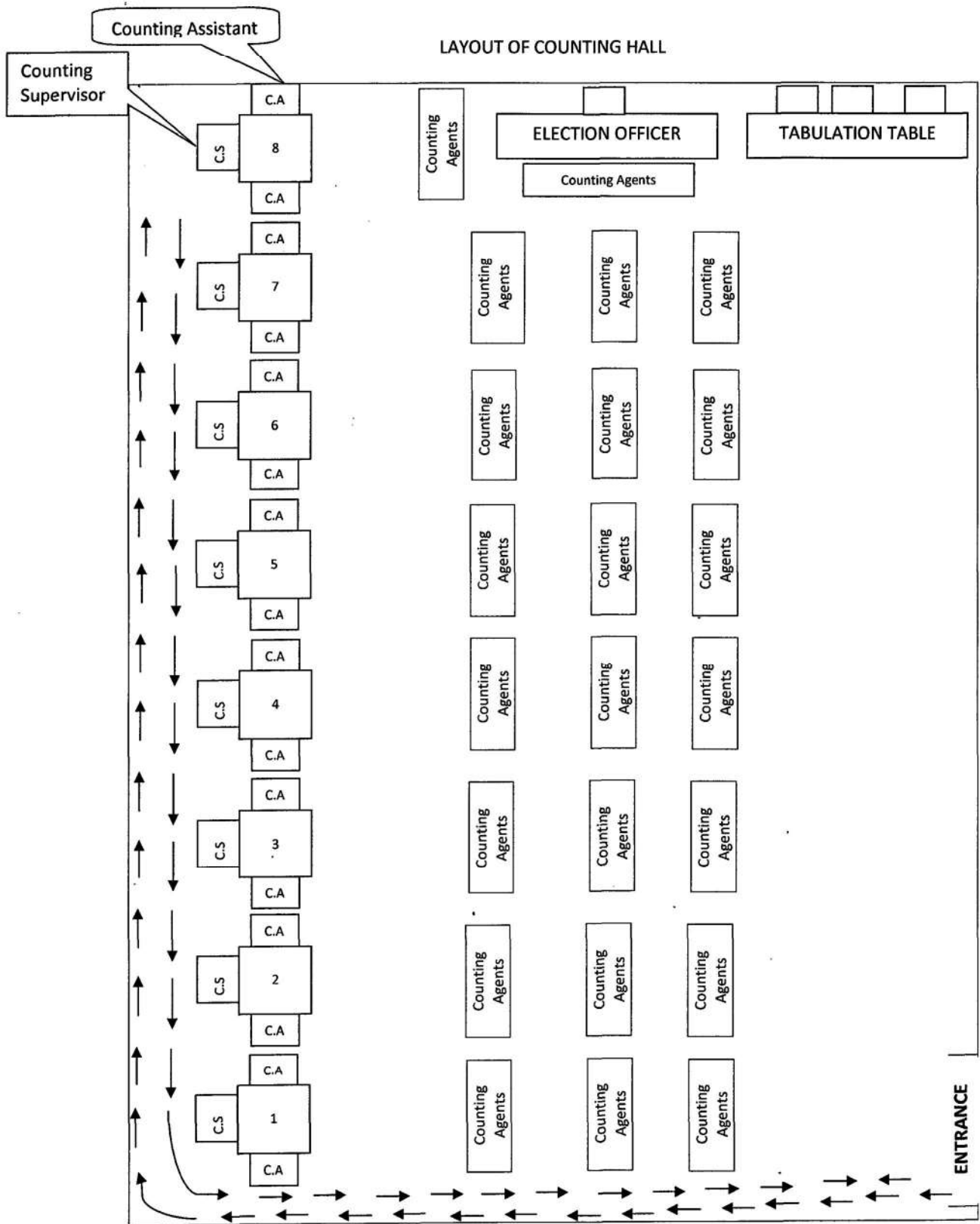
RECOUNTING:

- After declaration of result by the Election Officer has been made a candidate or in his absence, his counting agent may apply in writing to recount the votes either wholly or in part stating the grounds for such recounting.
- When the Election Officer declared the total number of votes polled by each candidate he should pause for a minute or two. If, during this period any candidate or in his absence his counting agent requested for recounting the Election Officer shall allow the time he would require for making an application for recounting in writing.
- If the Election Officer receives an application for recounting, he should consider the grounds urged and decide the matter judiciously. He may allow the application in whole or in part or may reject it in toto if it appears him to be frivolous or unreasonable.
- The right of a candidate to demand recounting does not mean that recounting can be granted for the mere asking. The candidate demanding recounting has to make a prima facie case that the counting was not accurate and recounting is necessary in the interest of justice.
- In every case the Election Officer should record a brief statement of reasons for the decision.
- The decision of Election Officer is final.
- If the Election Officer decides for recounting of the votes either wholly or in part, he shall take up the recounting in accordance with Rule 47 of the Odisha Gram Panchayat Election Rules, 1965. Rule 30 of the Odisha Panchayat Samiti Election Rules 1991 and Rule 52 of the Odisha Zilla Parishad Election Rules, 1994 is applicable for the Panchayat Samiti Member and Zilla Parishad Member respectively.
- After recounting the Election Officer shall make necessary corrections in the result sheet to the extent necessary after such recounting and announce the result on the basis of correction made by the Election Officer.
- No candidate/agent has right to demand recounting after the Election Officer has completed and signed the final result sheet. Any such demand should be rejected.
- Entire recounting process shall have to be videographed carefully.

SEALING:

- Soon after counting of votes are over the used Ballot Papers shall be sealed in packets (Not in Ballot Box) and stored in safe custody.
- Other important election documents shall be sealed properly and kept in the big trunk provided for each GP. and stored in safe custody.
- The Election Officer shall put a responsible official in charge the Sealing of all the packets as there is possibility of important documents being not available when a competent court orders the production of these materials.
- The documents relating to election proceedings received from the Presiding Officers and prepared by the Election Officer shall be retained in safe custody in the office of the Election Officer for a period of three months and shall then unless otherwise directed by a competent Court, be destroyed.
- The documents of records referred to above in the custody of the Election Officer shall not be opened or inspected or produced save with the prior permission of the Commissioner or of a competent Court.

N.B. *If, any of the above instructions come in conflict with the prescribed Rules for Conduct of Elections to Panchayati Raj Institutions, the prescribed Rules shall prevail over the above instructions. (2) The above guidelines are subject to modifications as and when required.*



CHAPTER-4

COVID - 19

The Covid-19 pandemic situation was a cause of great concern for the Commission to conduct election.

A high level meeting was held on 8th January, 2022 wherein the Chief Secretary, DC-cum-SRC and ACS, H & FW Department were present. The H & FW Department made a presentation on the trend of Covid-19 cases, status of the vaccination programme, vaccination for frontline workers and admissibility of the booster dose for the front line workers.

A threadbare discussion was held on crowd management during the election process particularly during filing of nomination, campaigning, dispersal of polling personnel and counting of votes.

The Commission issued an exhaustive COVID guideline in the shape of SOP for observance by the political parties, officials and voters in different stages of elections on 10.1.2022. Taking the ground situation into consideration and feedback of the H & FW Department the Commission announced schedule for holding elections on 11th January, 2022 with instructions that Covid-19 guidelines issued by the Commission on 10.01.2022 shall be strictly followed.

The Government of Odisha on request of the Commission took special permission of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India and all election related Officials were administered with precautionary booster dose even if they had not completed the mandatory gap of 6 month period. All the Districts were asked to make schedule for administering booster doze to Government officials likely to be associated in the election process and it was reviewed by the Commission on daily basis. The Commission placed funds with the District to make provision of sanitization of each polling booth and to make special arrangement for voting by Covid-19 affected patients.

The Commission while announcing the schedule put restrictions on number of persons who can accompany the candidate during filing of Nominations and Campaign. Only 5 persons were allowed to campaign which was subsequently increased to 20 as there was improvement in Covid-19 situation. No public meeting/rallies etc. were allowed during the entire election process. The Covid-19 situation had greatly improved by the time when the polls were held.



General Elections to Panchayati Raj Institutions, 2022
COVID-19 Guidelines

1. General:

- All person involved with the electoral process shall wear face mask during the concerned election related activities.
- Social distancing norms shall be strictly obeyed by all persons connected with election related activities as per the extant COVID guidelines of the State Government and Ministry of Home Affairs.
- All Polling Personnel/Security Personnel/Counting Staff shall be doubly vaccinated before being deployed/engaged in election related activities.
- No Polling Agent/Counting Agent is allowed to enter the Polling Station/Counting hall without double vaccination.
- As far as practicable, large halls should be identified and utilized to ensure social distancing norms.
- **Adequate number of vehicles shall be mobilized for movement of polling personnel, security personnel to ensure compliance of COVID-19 guidelines.**
- Create awareness among the public for COVID appropriate behavior including self-monitoring.

2. Election Store Room:

The election materials like forms and covers etc. shall be stored in disinfected room(s). Only designated officials shall be permitted to enter the store room and they shall follow all COVID-19 precautionary measures.

3. Training of Polling Personnel:

- Additional staff to be trained for polling & counting duties to take care of contingencies. They may be released before polling/counting.
- Pregnant and lactating mothers shall not be engaged.
- Persons having symptoms of COVID-19 positive shall not be engaged in Polling duty.
- A person from any Containment Zone or in Home Isolation shall not be deployed for election duty.
- As far as possible, persons suffering from co-morbidities susceptible to Covid-19 shall not be engaged in polling duty.
- Materials used for training purpose shall be sanitized.
- Training Hall shall have provision for Soap, Water Bucket and Mug.
- Taking into the capacity of Training Hall, training shall be given in phase-wise manner to avoid large gathering.
- During training all persons shall have to wear face mask.

4. Nomination Process:

Election Officers shall exercise the following COVID-19 guidelines while receiving nominations.

- Election Officers shall regularly wash their hands with soap/sanitizer and also wear face mask and hand gloves compulsorily.
- While filing nominations, either the candidate or one proposer shall enter the waiting room outside Election Officer's office maintaining proper social distance (two meters/6 feet). Similarly, either the candidate or his proposer shall be permitted to enter the room of the Election Officer. The next candidate shall be sent to the Election Officer's room only after the first candidate returns. All the candidates who reach the Election Officer's room within the prescribed time shall be given tokens on first come first served basis.
- A COVID positive patient shall submit nominations through his/her proposer.
- Candidates should compulsorily wear face mask before entering the Election Officer Office.
- Only one vehicle is allowed for the purpose of filing nomination. This may be strictly enforced.
- Election Officer's chamber should have sufficient space to perform the functions of nomination, scrutiny and symbol allocation following social distancing norms.
- Election Officer should allot staggered time in advance to prospective candidates.
- Large space for waiting for candidate(s) should be arranged.

5. Scrutiny of Nominations:

Scrutiny of nominations shall be done constituency wise in front of the candidates. Either candidate or the proposer or any person authorized by the candidate shall be present during scrutiny. The candidates shall compulsorily sanitize their hands, maintain social distance and wear face mask. On behalf of the COVID positive candidate, his/her proposer can be allowed inside the hall.

6. Withdrawal of Nominations:

Candidates are allowed to withdraw nomination and they shall sanitize their hands and compulsorily wear face mask, before entering the room of the Election Officers for doing the same within the prescribed time. COVID positive candidates shall give prior notice to the Election Officer about the proposer/agent for withdrawal of nomination.

7. Allotment of Symbols:

The List of final contesting candidates shall be prepared constituency wise and symbols be allotted accordingly. Candidates of concerned

constituencies shall be permitted to be present in the hall. If the number of candidates are more, symbols shall be allotted as laid down in rules. If more than one candidate opts for the same symbol, then the symbol shall be allotted by lottery following social distancing norms.

8. Election Campaign:

- In case of election to the Panchayati Raj Institutions, the area of the constituency being small, the campaign is restricted to the concerned constituency. The candidates can undertake door to door campaign with minimum supporters, maintaining social distance during the campaign and they shall all wear face masks without fail. The maximum persons allowed during door to door campaign is **5 (five)** including candidate.
- As far as possible the priority should be given to the campaign through social/electronic media.
- In view of COVID-19, campaigning in large groups is not allowed. The limit of the number of persons is five (5).
- COVID positive candidates shall restrict their campaign through electronic media only. Physical presence in campaign is strictly prohibited.
- Further, Political parties and candidates are advised to conduct their campaign as much as possible through digital/virtual/media platforms/mobile based mode instead of physical mode ensuring strict compliance of Covid safety norms.
- No Road show, padajatra, cycle/bike/vehicle rally and procession shall be allowed.
- No physical rally of Political Parties or probable candidates or any other groups related to election shall be allowed.
- No victory procession after the counting shall be allowed and not more than two persons shall be allowed to accompany the winning candidate.
- Political Parties/candidates having their Camp Office in different Wards be instructed to wear face mask and often sanitize their hands, either with sanitizer or soap and water. They shall encourage the voters to do the same while campaigning.
- *Anybody violating instructions on COVID-19 measures* will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under Section 188 of the IPC, and other legal provisions as applicable.

9. Containment Zone:

- When the location of booth happens to be in a Containment Zone it can be considered to shift the booth outside Containment Zone with prior permission of the Commission but only to an existing booth nearby.
- Before submitting proposal to shift the booth, the matter shall be formally discussed with Political Parties/Candidates whenever necessary.
- District Administration shall be vigilant to ensure strict observance of the COVID-19 Protocols instructions in the containment zone.

10. Preparations for Dispersal:

- As Dispersal takes place on the previous day of voting, all preparations shall be done in advance. Route map to dispatch the poll parties to their respective destinations as per COVID guidelines shall be prepared.
- To avoid overcrowding, District Administration shall identify multiple Dispersal Centres in the Block headquarters.
- The route map of polling stations allotted to each Dispersal Centre shall be displayed in all the Dispersal Centres.
- The polling personnel shall be intimated of the allotted Dispersal Centres.

11. KIT for Polling Officer:

- The following items shall be provided to every polling official and security personnel (Other than those where PPEs are needed) in addition to other prescribed items:
 - a) Mask
 - b) Sanitizer

12. Dispersal:

- On the day of dispersal, it is mandatory for all the Officials/Staff to wear face masks.
- On arrival of the polling Officials/Staff at the Dispersal Centre mandatory thermal check up for fever shall be conducted and sanitizer shall be provided. After ensuring there are no COVID symptoms, they shall be allowed inside the dispersal Centre.
- The Dispersal area shall be sanitized.
- Polling Party shall be dispersed to their respective stations in a staggered manner to avoid crowd.
- Required numbers of face masks for use by the Polling Party should be supplied.
- One Litre of sanitizer be given to each Polling Party.
- Thermal scanning of each polling personnel and the Drivers/Helpers be done and recorded in the Register.
- The vehicles before proceeding to booth and returning from the booth after polling be sanitized at the Dispersal centre.
- Polling parties shall travel only in the vehicles assigned to them. Care shall be taken not to overcrowd any vehicle.
- Soap, Bucket, Mug also be supplied.
- Large Halls/ spaces should be identified for distribution/collection of election material following all safety, sanitation and social distancing measures.
- Large halls/spaces should be identified for distribution/collection of election material.

- Prior staggered time should be allocated to the polling teams for distribution/ Collection of Election Materials.
- Different counters of the Dispersal centre shall be situated at least 6 ft. distance.
- The Polling Personnel shall collect Election Materials from different counters following social distancing.

13. Polling Station Arrangements and Day of Poll:

- In the Polling booth, the Polling Personnel, Polling Agents, Voters and candidates shall follow the guidelines issued by the State Government from time to time.
- Mandatory sanitization of Polling Station, preferably, a day before the poll.
- Markers to demonstrate social distancing for queue.
- Earmarking circle for 15-20 persons of 2 yards (6 feet) distance for voters standing in the queue depending on the availability of space.
- There shall be three queues, for male, female, and PWD/Senior citizen voters.
- The services of Volunteers, Home Guard/ Civil Defence/ NCC etc may be utilised to monitor and regulate social distancing norms and sanitization of persons.
- The Police personnel, Home Guards etc. shall regulate the work of sanitization, voters in queue maintaining social distancing.
- Soap and Water shall be provided at the entry/exit point of every polling station.
- Sanitizer should be provided at the entry/exit point of every polling station.
- Reserve Face Masks will be kept for those voter who are not carrying the same.
- Awareness posters on COVID-19 should be displayed at visible locations.
- Seating arrangement in polling station for the polling personnel and polling agents shall be made as per the norms of social distancing. If it is seen that the seating arrangement is not possible in the voting Hall by social distancing, the Polling Agents can sit outside the Hall where they can observe/see the voting process.
- If Polling Agent or Counting Agent is having temperature above the prescribed limit, then their reliever shall be allowed by Presiding Officer, which may be recorded.
- During the process of identification of voter, the voters may be asked to lower the face mask for identification, when required.
- 1 (one) voter shall be allowed to stand in front of each polling official maintaining social distance.
- When voting is in Ballot Paper cross mark seals be used for the voting purpose after sanitizing the same alternatively by the third polling officer.

In each case the seal is to be sanitized before being handed over to the voters.

- Sanitizers shall be kept inside the booth at appropriate locations with clear direction for the use by Polling Personnel.
- Polling Agent or Counting Agent shall be asked to put on face mask during the process. The Presiding Officer should ensure that this is observed. While issuing Appointment Order to the Polling/Counting Agents it shall be clearly mentioned that the appointment of Polling Agent may be withdrawn if Covid-19 norms are violated by him/her.
- Apart from the room earmarked for the booth, another room may also be kept ready for Persons including Voters and Official who appear to be suffering from Covid-19 flu type symptoms so that they can wait in the earmarked Room.
- If symptoms of COVID-19 are noticed in Polling Staff or drivers of the vehicle during the poll period they may be kept in a separate room arranged for taking rest until medical treatment or shifting to nearby medical or home isolation.
- Local PHC may be contacted for screening of temperature.
- Data/information may be collected before hand from Local PHC/Hospital for Home isolation people/Containment Zone.
- The same shall be reflected in the margin of the Electoral Roll against the elector.
- The Volunteers who are engaged in the arrangement shall be handed over a copy so that they can advise the people to come for vote on the later part of the voting time.
- COVID-19 patients who are quarantined will be allowed to cast their vote **during the last hour of the poll day** at their respective Polling Stations, under the supervision of health authorities, strictly following COVID-19 related preventive measures. Sector Officer shall coordinate this in their allotted polling stations. This will be done under the strict supervision of health authorities.

Entry of Voter and Voting Procedures:

- Each voter before entering the Polling station shall strictly adhere to all COVID-19 protocols,
- Applying Indelible Ink: The Polling Officers shall carefully apply the ink without physical contact. If the voter is wearing the hand gloves, the Polling Officers shall ask him/her to remove it and then apply the ink to the proper finger.
- Handing over of ballot paper: The Polling Officer assigned with the task of handing over ballot shall give the ballot paper to the voter. After that, as per procedure voter's signature/thumb impression in the counterfoil shall be taken.

- Voters shall not be allowed to touch the ballot box. If the ballot paper is not inserted properly inside the ballot box, the Presiding Officer shall properly insert the ballot paper with the help of the sanitized pusher provided for the purpose.
 - Closure of Polling: Immediately after the completion of the polling, Presiding Officer shall seal the ballot box and along with statutory documents and shall return in the vehicle while maintaining proper social distancing.
- 14. Setting up of de-dispersal Centre, Strong Room and Counting Centre:**
- Large halls shall be identified keeping in mind the de-dispersal activity, strong room facility and counting activity to ensure social distancing.
 - To avoid overcrowding, District Administration shall identify multiple de-dispersal/counting Centres in the Block headquarters
 - Strong Room has to be disinfected before and after keeping the sealed Ballot boxes and statutory covers. Care shall be taken not to cause any damage to the Ballot boxes and other documents while disinfecting.
- 15. De-Dispersal or Receiving Centre:**
- Large gatherings in the de-Dispersal Centres shall be avoided and proper social distancing measures shall be undertaken.
 - De-Dispersal/Receiving Staff and Polling Officers shall invariably wear face mask and hand gloves during the process.
- 16. Preparation of the Counting Centre:**
- The identified rooms/halls for counting have to be disinfected on the previous day of counting and necessary arrangements shall be made properly before sealing it.
 - During the counting process either the candidate or his/her authorized agent shall be allowed to sit inside the counting hall. Barricade shall be erected to avoid touching the ballot papers by the candidate/agents.
 - Counting activity shall be done strictly following COVID-19 guidelines.
 - Large gatherings outside the counting Centre shall be prohibited.
 - Vaccination certificate to be checked before allowing entry to counting centre.
 - Compulsory testing (RTPCR or RAT) for all persons entering counting centre within 48 hours of start of counting even if they are double vaccinated.
- 16. Counting of Votes:**
- Every person shall have to wear face mask. All persons before entering Counting Hall be thermally scanned and use sanitizer.
 - A large Hall may be identified for the purpose. If large Hall is not identified, then counting may be conducted in separate adjacent rooms

for different wards. But counting shall be done for one ward at a time in a single room.

- Sitting Arrangement shall be so made that the procedure of counting can be seen properly. After counting, the candidate and Counting Agent shall be asked to leave the Hall for counting of next ward so on, unless there is demand for recounting.
- Large gatherings and procession by the winning candidates are prohibited.
- Counting Centre shall be disinfected before and after the counting.
- Counting Hall be sufficiently big to maintain social distancing, proper ventilation, windows, exhaust fan etc.
- Anyone, even after being doubly vaccinated, having any symptom of COVID like fever, Cold etc. will not be allowed in Counting hall.
- Every Counting Official and Security personnel be provided with Mask, Sanitizer.
- No public gathering outside the counting venue during process of counting.
- Candidate may appoint/replace counting agents in case report is positive.

17. Conduct of Indirect Election

- One day before the meeting, the Meeting Hall be sanitized.
- The seats for Members and Officials be arranged keeping safe distance.
- The articles/materials including Ballot Boxes used for voting shall be properly sanitized.
- On the day of voting, hand Sanitizer be kept at the entry point of the Hall.
- Before entering the Meeting Hall, thermal scanner be used for recording of temperature of all officials and Members with the help of local Medical.
- All Officials and Members are required to wear face mask on the day of meeting.

NB: The Commission reserves the right to modify the above guidelines as and when required taking the prevailing situation into consideration.

Whereas, Commission has reviewed the present situation and trends relating to Covid-19;



2. Public meetings can be organized by the Political Parties/Contesting Candidates with prior permission of the appropriate authority with maximum 300 persons in open ground subject to strict observance of Covid-19 protocols i.e. compulsory use of face mask and social distancing.

The above orders will be given effect from today i.e. 07.02.2022.

The guidelines issued on 10.01.2022 is modified to the above extent.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 08.01.2022 AT 11.00 AM TO REVIEW COVID-19 SITUATION IN THE STATE.

Sri Aditya Prasad Padhi, IAS (Retd.), State Election Commissioner presided over the meeting.

Sri Suresh Chandra Mohapatra, IAS, Chief Secretary, Odisha; Sri Pradip Kumar Jena, IAS, Development Commissioner-cum-Additional Chief Secretary to Government & Special Relief Commissioner and Sri R.K.Sharma, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Health &F.W.Department and other Officers of the Health & F.W. Department were present in the meeting.

Additional Chief Secretary, Health &F.W.Department made a brief presentation on the COVID-19 situation in the State. The presentation included trend of increasing COVID-19 variants, status of the vaccination programme and vaccination for the front line worker and admissibility of the booster doze for the front line workers.

Discussions were held to assess the consequence where crowds will assemble during the election process, specifically during filing of nomination, scrutiny, dispersal and Receiving centre, campaigning and counting of votes. There was threadbare discussion for the restrictions to be imposed during the above activities.

Rapid Antigen Test and RTPCR test for the officials to be associated with the election process and willing counting agents were also discussed.

State Election Commissioner directed that the vaccination programme specifically the 2nd dose to the eligible citizens shall be expedited with special emphasis on the frontline workers and the officials to be associated with the election process.

The meeting ended with thanks to the Chair.


I am directed to say that the State Election Commission, Odisha is holding General Elections to Panchayats in the State. The elections will be held in 5 phases and will be completed on 28th February, 2022.

There are 91913 Wards for which elections will be held in all 30 Districts of the State. A large number of polling personnel, police personnel and other Government officials at the Block and District level, Election Observers, Staff of the Commission etc. will be engaged in the election process for the next one and a half months.

The Commission desires that all the officials involved in the election process be declared as front line workers and such staff may be administered with the precautionary dose of Covid-19 vaccine, even if the 9 month period from the 2nd dose of vaccination is not over.

I would, therefore, request you to take necessary steps to declare the officials/staff associated with the Panchayat election process as front line workers and provide them the precautionary doze at the earliest. Such a facility has already been provided for all poll officials in the five States going for Assembly elections in February/March, 2022.

Sir,

With reference to the subject cited above, I am to say that till date (20th January), 5.5 crore doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been administered to citizens in the State. The precautionary dose of COVID-19 vaccination of HCWs, FLWs and citizens aged 60 years & above with co-morbidities has started from the 10th January 2022 in the State and 3 lakh doses have been administered to eligible beneficiaries so far.

In this regard, it may be noted that General Elections to PRIs, 2022 is going to be held in the State in 5 phases covering 91,913 wards across 30 districts, and will be completed on the 28th February 2022. A large numbers of polling personnel, police personnel and other Govt. officials will be deployed at the Block & District level for smooth conduct of the election. Besides, Election Observers, staff of the Commission etc. will also be engaged in the election process for the next one & half months. All these officials involved in the election process would be highly vulnerable to COVID-19 infection.

In view of the above, it is requested that all the officials involved in the election process may be allowed to be administered with the precautionary dose of COVID-19 vaccine, even if, the 9 months period from the 2nd dose vaccination is not over, as has already been allowed by GoI for all polling officials in the

five States going for Assembly elections in February/March, 2022 vide D.O. No. 2128363/2021/Imm. dated, the 15th January 2022, Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & F.W. Accordingly, necessary provisions in the CO-WIN portal may also be made.

CHAPTER-5

CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS.

On completion of preparation of Electoral Roll and after submission of the hard copy of Electoral Roll to the Commission, the Commission announced schedule on 11.01.2022 for holding elections to all the 6794 Gram Panchayats in the State. Elections to the post of Sarpanch of Dhinkia G.P. and 23 Ward Members of the said Gram Panchayat were excluded from the list as due in a different time. Hence, schedule was announced for holding elections for 91890 Ward Members, 6793 Sarpanches & Panchayat Samiti Members and 853 Zilla Parishad Members. Elections were held in 5 phases starting from 16th February, 2022 to 24th February, 2022 with one day gap for each day of poll. Elections were held Blockwise and election to all the Zilla Parishad Constituencies coming within a Block were completed on a single day. Elections were held in 5 phases in 25 Districts, 4 phases in 2 Districts, 3 phases in 2 Districts, 2 phases in 1 District.

Apart from conducting direct elections to the above offices scheduled was also issued alongwith the main schedule for holding indirect elections to the offices of Naib Sarpanch, Block Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Zilla Parishad President and Vice-President.

For smooth and safe conduct of Panchayat Elections in the State a high level meeting was held on 15.1.2022 wherein the Chief Secretary, DG & IG of Police, Addl. Chief Secretary, Health & FW Department, Additional Chief Secretary, Home; Principal Secretary, PR&DW and other senior officers were physically present in the Commission's office and all Collectors and Superintendents of Police were present virtually in their V.C. Room.

Training was imparted to all the Election Officers on different aspects of election process starting from nomination, scrutiny, allotment of symbols and counting. 2nd schedule was issued on 25.01.2022 inviting nomination for holding fresh elections to the Wards, Gram Panchayats, P.S. Constituencies and Z.P. Constituencies where no nominations filed or all the nominations were

rejected. The 2nd round of nominations were accepted in the above situation but the date of poll remain unchanged. With the announcement of election schedule by the Commission the Model Code of Conduct came into force and it continued till the counting of votes were over i.e. for the period from 11.1.2022 to 28.2.2022. The State Election Commissioner issued directions to the Chief Secretary for ban on transfer of officials associated with elections including police personnel, enforcement of Model Code of Conduct and maintenance of strict neutrality during the election process by all the Government officials.



CHAPTER-6

PARINAAM PORTAL

(Online Submission of Counting of Votes & Results of Z.P Members)

The Commission with the support of OCAC, Bhubaneswar developed a software namely '**PARINAAM PORTAL**' to show the real time trend of counting of votes . Each Block was entrusted with the responsibility to submit the result in the portal soon after counting of votes of each Ward is completed. Each Block was given an User Id and Password to open the portal on the day of counting and they posted the result on completion of counting of each Ward and the same was displayed in a large screen in the Commission as well as in the District office. For online submission of the result the Block officials were imparted training virtually by the Commission. All the Blocks submitted the election result immediately after wardwise counting of votes and same could be shared with the media promptly. The real time information was disseminated to all quarters in time.

The online submission of result of the Zilla Parishad Members was done for the first time with the active support of the OCAC, Bhubaneswar who developed the software. Online submission of result was the biggest hallmark in the entire election process.

CHAPTER-7

PERCENTAGE OF POLLING

The Elections to Panchayati Raj Institutions create a lot of interest among the public and there has always been heavy participation in the elections to Panchayats. The percentage of participation is always 75% or above. In this election the overall poll percentage was 78.96%. This figure is almost the same as that of 2017 Panchayat elections. In comparison to the elections to Assembly and Parliament the percentage of participation is always 10-15% more for PRI elections. The Percentage of voters participation in this particular election is noteworthy in respect of Malkangiri District. Elections could not be held in Chitrakonda Block during 2017 Panchayat Elections and all the posts remained vacant for five years. Because of the positive steps taken by the District Administration, Malkangiri there was an overwhelming participation in this election in the Maoist affected areas also.

CHAPTER-8

PRINTING OF BALLOT PAPERS.

All the four variety of Ballot Papers were printed at the Government Press, Cuttack. As usual, the Commission changed the colour of the Ballot Papers for the elections to PRIs, 2022 and the colour of the Ballot Papers were yellow for Ward Member, Pink for Sarpanch, Blue for Panchayat Samiti Member and White for Zilla Parishad Members. Ballot Papers were printed with watermark logo of the Commission as a security measure. A new watermark was used during the present election. The procurement of specially manufactured paper was done by the Government Press, Cuttack. The Ballot Papers for Ward Members, Sarpanch and P.S. Members were printed and despatched to all the Districts by mid of January, 2022. The above Ballot Papers were having 10 symbols without name of the contesting candidates and during the poll the unwanted portion was folded. So far as the printing of Ballot Papers for Zilla Parishad Member is concerned the same was taken up after publication of the final list of contesting candidates. The Ballot Papers for Zilla Parishad Members were printed with names and symbols allotted to each candidate. The total period taken for printing of Zilla Parishad Ballot Papers was 20 days and the Ballot Papers reached the Districts at least one week before the date of poll. The following numbers of Ballot papers were printed for the election.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING WITH DIRECTOR (TECHNICAL), PRINTING, STATIONERY & PUBLICATION, ODISHA, CUTTACK HELD ON 07.10.2021 IN THE OFFICE OF THE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION, ODISHA.

A meeting under the Chairmanship of the Secretary, State Election Commission was held wherein Director (Technical), Printing, Stationery & Publication alongwith the Deputy Director (Printing); Deputy Secretary, State Election Commission and officials of the Commission as well as the Government press attended the said meeting.

The Secretary initiating the discussion apprised the importance of the Government Press in printing of various election related materials including Ballot Papers for smooth conduct of Panchayat Elections in the State. As the thing stands the printing work has been delayed during this time for which an all out effort shall be made both by the office of the Commission as well as the Government Press to recover the lost time and complete the works in time.

The Director (Technical) gave a brief description of the preparatory works undertaken by the Government Press for smooth conduct of the printing work. He also informed that Government Press is hard pressed due to year ending works of other Departments, but assured that so far as the election work is concerned, this will be attended on priority and be delivered in time as per the dateline mutually agreed. The Secretary of the Commission apprised that Government Press may find alternative method to deliver the election works in time.

So far as the printing items are concerned, the printing work of 3 different Forms for Preparation of Electoral Rolls is going on at the Government Press Cuttack and it was decided that the above Forms will be distributed to the Districts on 21-10-2021 and 22-10-2021 from the Govt. Press. The Commission's office will furnish the Districtwise distribution list very soon. For printing of Envelopes and Labels the approved proof copy will be sent to the Government Press today. The Government Press will furnish the proof copy of different forms pending with them in a day or two.

Most important point of discussion was prim tin of Ballot Papers for which a special paper has to be manufactured with the design of the Water Mark logo in it. The Commission will furnish the authorization to procure the watermark paper very shortly and after that other formalities like tender and procurement of the paper will be done by the Government Press. After a threadbare discussion it was decided that an all out effort shall be made to complete the printing of Ballot Papers for Ward Members, Sarapanch and P.S. Member by 31st December, 2021 positively.

It was decided that the Commission will release funds in favour of the Government Press for procurement of raw materials upon receipt of the intimation by the Government Press, Cuttack. The details for printing of different items is as follows :

I am directed to say that the Commission has made arrangement for printing of ballot paper for Zilla Parishad Election at Govt. Press, Odisha, Cuttack. Immediately after publication of final list of contesting candidates on 25.01.2022 in Form No. 8 under Odisha Zilla Parishad Election Rules, 1994 the concerned Election Officer, has to furnish the list of contesting candidates in Form No. 8 and the symbols allotted to the candidates in Form No. 7 to the District Office same day forthwith. After a thorough check at District level these particulars shall be sent the Commission's Office through E-mail immediately. Besides, a responsible officer along with a staff familiar with the subject so as to reach the Govt. Press, Cuttack with Form No. 7 and 8 in duplicates and requirement of Ballot Paper Zilla Parishad constituency wise on the date prescribed below for the District.

The Constituency-wise number of ballot papers required may be calculated as per the Commission's instruction vide letter No.2905 dt.21.10.2021. The staff deputed for the purpose shall come prepared to remain for 3-4 days and attend the proof reading of the ballot paper to ensure that there is no error in the spelling of names of the candidates and symbols allotted to them. After printing of ballot paper is over, the dispatch

programme of ballot papers to the District will be intimated to arrange for safe transport of the same to the District Head Quarters on proper Police Escort.

CHAPTER-10

SEALS

The Commission required 7 varieties of seals to be used by the polling officer as well as by the Election Officer for the election. The General Manager, DIC, Bhubaneswar; General Manager, DIC, Cuttack; M.D., OSIC, Cuttack were requested to furnish the name of Registered Firms for supply of seals. Accordingly, 6 names were sponsored by the DIC. The Firms were requested to quote their price in sealed quotation. A purchase Committee was constituted by the Commission with Director, EPM, GM, DIC, Bhubaneswar, representatives of PR & DW Department and Secretary, Special Secretary, Deputy Secretary and Law Officer of the State Election Commission, Odisha. Two firms namely M/S. Sarala Rubber Stamp, Bhubaneswar and M/S. Orissa Art Studio, Cuttack were selected by the purchase committee to supply different varieties of seals and they successfully delivered the material in time for use in the election.

Seven Vanities of Seals were procured. The Details are mentioned Below:

CHAPTER-11

INDELIBLE INK.

For conduct of elections in the entire State, the requirement of indelible ink was 1,96,000 5ml bottles. Two 5 ml phials were required for each booth and some surplus inks to be used by the Sector Officers were supplied from the office of the Commission. An advertisement was published in the All India Editions of Times of India on 11.10.2021 inviting National Tender for procurement of Indelible Ink. Four Firms from different States participated in the Tender process and the rates quoted by M/S. Rayudu Laboratories Limited, Hyderabad was the lowest and the firm delivered the required Indelible Inks in time. The Indelible Ink supplied were tested in the Government Testing laboratory, Khapuria, Cuttack and the Laboratory confirmed the items supplied are as per the specification.

CHAPTER-12

EX-GRATIA COMPENSATION

Ex-gratia compensation is being paid by the Commission since 4th General Elections to PRIs, 2012 in consonance with the compensation being paid by the Election Commission of India. This ex-gratia compensation is meant for the Govt. employees and Police Personnel associated with the election process. This gives confidence to the personnel associated with the election process because of various incidents that occurred in the past.

This Commission adopts the rates as is being paid by the ECI for different types of compensation due to death/injury. During this current election, cases of death and injuries were reported due to accidents and other reasons. A fatal accident occurred in the District of Nawarangpur during movement of Police Personnel from one destination to another. Three police personnel died on the spot and several others were injured. The Commission took prompt action in sanctioning ex-gratia compensation in favour of the family members, in all reported case of death and injuries.

ORDER

In suppression of this State Election Commission, Odisha Order No 1544 dated 30.01.2017 and taking into consideration of the quantum of ex-gratia amount fixed by the Home (Elections) Department vide Order No 9136 dated 20.4.2019 and Notification No 5444 dated 29thOctober,2020, the State Election Commission, Odisha has been pleased to revise the scale for payment of *ex-gratia* compensation to the families of person on election duty who die and also the personnel who sustain injuries leading to incapacitation whether by accident or any other means arising out of and in course of election duty/death arising out of COVID-19 during **General Elections to Panchayats,2022 and thereafter including by-elections.**

2. Such ex-gratia shall be **compassionate** compensation as per this Order shall be applicable to all Civil persons whether Government (both Centre and State) / Corporation (including Central and State P.S.U.) / Local bodies or Drivers & Helpers of Government and private vehicles and police personnel including Central Police Forces (C.P.F) engaged by the competent authority for election related duty in the State of Odisha during **General Elections to Panchayats,2022 and thereafter including byelections.**

3. A person is to be treated on election duty, as soon as he /she leaves his / her residence / office to report for any election related duty, including training and until he / she reaches back his / her residence / office after performance of his / her election related duty. Any mishap takes place during **the said** period shall be treated as having occurred on election duty subject to the condition that there should be a casual connection between occurrence of death / injury and the election duty.

4. The rates of ex-gratia compensation shall be decided as mentioned below below:—

5. The Death Certificate specifying the reason of death has to issued by the Medical Officer and countersigned by the CDMO concerned certifying specifically that the Death is caused due to COVID-19. The duty period is to be counted from the date and time of reporting for election duty before the Election Officer and ends with being relieved by the Election Officer from election duty.

6. The family of the deceased personnel or the personnel disabled/grievously injured on election duty will be eligible to the above grant subject to production of the following documents from the appropriate authorities in support of the claim.

- (a) Duly filled in claim form
- (b) Certificate from the Collector that the deceased/ disabled was on Election Duty.
- (c) Certificate from the District Superintendent of Police that the deceased / disabled personnel was on Election Duty (In case of police personnel / (C.P.F).
- (d) A copy of First Information Report (FIR)
- (e) Postmortem report in case of mishap/unnatural/unidentified death
- (f) Appointment letter as a proof of appointment in Election Duty where ever applicable
- (g) Medical Report of the CDMO of the District / Government Medical Colleges Hospital.

7. In case of permanent disability sustained by the election related personnel, as stated in **Para 4 above**, a certificate has to be obtained from the Medical Board Duly constituted by the concerned CDMO

8. In case of grievous injuries and multiple fractures leading to temporary and prolonged incapacitation, detailed medical report (including X-rays etc.) should be furnished as per **Para 6(g) above**.

9. The injured personnel on election duty himself and in the case of deceased, the legal heirs of his family shall within a period of **three months** from the date of injury/death, as the case may be, submit an application for compassionate grant to the concerned Collector in Form -I in case death and Form-II in case of disability/temporary and prolonged incapacitation.

10. The concerned Election Officer shall draw up a report in Form-I in case of death and Form-II in case of disability / temporary and prolonged incapacitation

11. The application and report referred to above shall be sent by the concerned Election Officer with his recommendation to the **State Election Commission, Odisha** within **one month** of the receipt of the application, who may sanction the compassionate grant in favour of the family members in the event of death or the person in case of disability.

12. This benefit is also applicable for the period of Bye- election conducted in the State. Further, it is clarified that the staff those who are engaged in the conduct of election work in the office of SEC, Odisha, Office of the Collector and Sub-ordinate Office are also eligible to avail the aforesaid benefit.

13. To avoid duplicity, the one time compassionate grant payable as per payable as per Finance Department Resolution No. Pen-51/2000-9794/F., dated the 7th March 2001, Resolution No. Pen- 64/2001-53885/F., dated the 2nd November 2001 & Corrigendum Memo No.Pen- 64/2001-5204/F., dated the 2nd February 2002 Resolution No. Pen- 144/2008- 43870/F., dated the 25th September 2008 and Resolution No. Pen -73/2008- 2510/F., dated the 12th January 2009 for death and injury / disability **will not be payable** to the families of Government employees / Government employees covered under this Order during the period this order remains in force.

14.. "Family" shall have the same meaning as provided in clause (b) of rule 2 of the O.C.S. (Compassionate Grant) Rules, 1964.

15.. The decision of the **State Election Commission, Odisha**. regarding sanction of quantum of compassionate grant is final.

16. The Commission further directs that the matter be looked into promptly by the officers so that the family member or the person himself/herself is not be harassed to get the document. If such matter is brought to the notice of the Commission, the State Election Commission will take stern action against the officer(s) for whom the matter is delayed.

17. This has been concurred by Finance Department vide **File No FIN-SOS2-MISC-0022-2021** communicated by PR and DW Department No PR-SEC-Bud-0002-2021/768 dated 11.01.2022.

CHAPTER-13

RECENT AMENDMENTS TO PANCHAYAT LAWS

The 6th General Elections to PRIs, 2022 is important in more than one way because of the various amendments undertaken by the State Government in the Panchayat Acts and Rules before the General Elections, 2022. Some of the recommendations by the Commission for amendments of provisions relating to the counting of votes at Block Headquarters and filing of affidavit were under consideration of the State Government since 2002. Further, amendments relating to reservation for SC/ST/BCC limiting it to 50% was pending to comply with the Judgment dated 11.5.2010 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

Reservation for SC/ST & BCC:

Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide their Judgment dated 11.05.2010 in K.Krishnamurthy Vrs. Union of India directed that reservation for SC/ST/BCC shall be limited to 50% except in PESA areas. So far as Odisha is concerned this issue was raised before the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa during 2012 & 2017 Panchayat Elections. However, for different reasons the elections were conducted in time with the reservation already prescribed in the Acts. The State Govt. after a long legal battle lost the matter in the Supreme Court of India and necessary amendments were made on 23.09.2021 in the concerned Panchayat Acts limiting the reservation to 50%.

Counting at Block Headquarters:

This Commission was in protracted correspondence with the State Government since the year 2002 to do away with the Rules for counting at the Polling Stations. This counting at the Polling Station was the cause of several issues including law and order situations. The Commission since the year 2002 after 2nd General Elections vigorously pursued the matter for the Counting at the Block Headquarters. Ultimately before the 6th General Elections 2022, the State Govt. vide Notification dated 18.9.2021 amended the concerned Rules for

which Counting of votes was taken up on different dates at the Block Headquarters successfully.

Affidavit:

This Commission in obedience to the Orders dated 2nd May 2002 and 13th March, 2003 of the Hon'ble Apex Court of India prescribed vide order dated 1.1.2004 for filing of affidavit by those contesting for the offices of Sarapanch/P.S.Members/Z.P.Members. The Order No.1 dated 1.1.2004 of the Commission was issued in exercise of plenary powers. The Commission recommended for amendment of the concerned Acts which will make those filing false affidavit liable for prosecution. In absence of amendment of the Acts, the violators could not be prosecuted. The amendment of the State Government dated 24.12.2021 made filing of false affidavit punishable.

Authorised Agent of Political Party.

During the 5th General Elections to PRIs, 2017 the State Government amended the provision of the Odisha Zilla Parishad Election Rule 1991 incorporating a new provision that any political party whose Member as an elector casts a vote for the President/Vice-President of the Zilla Parishad, the party may authorize an agent and before the elector inserts the ballot papers into the box, allow the authorized Agent of that political party to verify to whom such elector has cast his vote. This amendment of the State Government was struck down by the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa mainly for reasons-(1) the draft amendment was not published inviting objections and suggestions, and (2) the timing of the amendment was not right. During the 6th General Elections to PRIs, 2022 necessary amendments of the O.Z.P.E. Rules, 1991 was done by the State vide Order dtd.7.1.2022 following due procedure.

1. (1) These rules may be called the Odisha Grama Panchayat Election (Amendment) Rules, 2021.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the *Odisha Gazette*.

2. In the Odisha Grama Panchayat Election Rules, 1965 (hereinafter referred to as the said rules), in rule 47, -

(i) for sub-rule (1), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:—

"(1)After the close of polling, the Presiding Officer shall seal the Ballot Box, in presence of candidates or their polling agents who may be present , prepare

separate sealed packets of all papers and reports and forward the same to the Election Officer, after which the Election Officer shall proceed to take up counting of votes on the scheduled date in the presence of the candidates and their polling agents, if any, who may be present at the counting centre"; and

(ii) in sub-rule (2), for the words "Presiding Officer" the words "Election Officer" shall be substituted.

3. In the said rules, in rules 48, 49 and 50, for the words "Presiding Officer" the words "Election Officer" shall be substituted.

4. In the said rules, in rule 50-A, -

(i) for sub-rule(1), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:—

"(1) The Presiding Officer shall after close of the poll, seal the ballot box and voting machine in presence of candidates or their Polling Agents who may be present, prepare separate bundles of all papers and reports and forward the same to the Election Officer on same day after which the Election Officer shall proceed to take up counting of the votes on the scheduled date in presence of candidates or their agent, if any, who may be present at counting centre."

(ii) in sub-rules (3), (4) and (5) for the words "Presiding Officer" the words "Election Officer" shall be substituted.

5. In the said rules, in rule 50-B,-

(i) in sub-rules (1) and (2) , for the words "Presiding Officer" the words "Election Officer" shall be substituted; and

(ii) sub-rule (3) shall be omitted.

6. In the said rules, for sub-rule (1) of rule 51, the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:—

"(1) Immediately after the close of counting and before declaration of result of elections in respect of polling for the office of Sarpanch or Ward Members, as the case may be, the Election Officer shall carefully total the votes polled by the candidates and count the ballot papers contained in the sealed packets received under rule 92-G in the presence of the candidates concerned or their polling agents, if any, who may be present and declare the result in Form No.8-B after recording it in a separate report the total number of the votes polled by each contesting candidate. The candidates securing the largest number of votes shall be declared duly elected as the Sarpanch. In the

case of an equality of votes, the result shall be decided by drawing lots and the candidate whose name is drawn first shall be declared elected.”

7. In the said rules, in rule 52, the words “on the basis of the reports of the Presiding Officers of each ward in regard to election of Ward Members and his own report relating to election of the Sarpanch” shall be omitted.

8. In the said rules, in Form No.7, Serial No. 4 and the entries against it shall be omitted.

9. In the said rules, in Form No.7B, 8 and 8A, for the words “Presiding Officer”, the words “Election Officer” shall be substituted.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 08.01.2022 AT 11.00 AM TO REVIEW COVID-19 SITUATION IN THE STATE.

Sri Aditya Prasad Padhi, IAS (Retd.), State Election Commissioner presided over the meeting.

Sri Suresh Chandra Mohapatra, IAS, Chief Secretary, Odisha; Sri Pradip Kumar Jena, IAS, Development Commissioner-cum-Additional Chief Secretary to Government & Special Relief Commissioner and Sri R.K.Sharma, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary, Health &F.W.Department and other Officers of the Health & F.W. Department were present in the meeting.

Additional Chief Secretary, Health &F.W.Department made a brief presentation on the COVID-19 situation in the State. The presentation included trend of increasing COVID-19 variants, status of the vaccination programme and vaccination for the front line worker and admissibility of the booster doze for the front line workers.

Discussions were held to assess the consequence where crowds will assemble during the election process, specifically during filing of nomination, scrutiny, dispersal and Receiving centre, campaigning and counting of votes. There was threadbare discussion for the restrictions to be imposed during the above activities.

Rapid Antigen Test and RTPCR test for the officials to be associated with the election process and willing counting agents were also discussed.

State Election Commissioner directed that the vaccination programme specifically the 2nd dose to the eligible citizens shall be expedited with special emphasis on the frontline workers and the officials to be associated with the election process.

The meeting ended with thanks to the Chair.

Minutes of the Virtual Conference with the Collectors & Superintendents of Police held on 15.01.2022.

Sri Aditya Prasad Padhi, State Election Commissioner presided over the meeting.

The Meeting was attended by the Chief Secretary, Odisha; DG & IG of Police, Odisha; Additional Chief Secretary, Health & F.W.; Additional Chief Secretary, Home; Principal Secretary, PR & DW Department; Addl. D.G.(Law 8s Order); Mission Director, NHM; Director, Health Services in the OSWAN Conference Hall of the State Election Commission. All Revenue Divisional Commissioners/Range LGs and DIGs; Commissioner of Police; all Collectors, Deputy Commissioners of Police and Superintendents of Police attended the meeting virtually in OSWAN Platform in the District OSWAN Centres.

The State Election Commissioner in his inaugural address outlined that the next General Elections to PRIs, 2022 have to be held with Covid-19 Guidelines prescribed by the Commission as safety of everybody including Govt, officials, candidate, voters etc. is the prime responsibility of administration. Safe elections can be possible if Covid-19 protocols are strictly followed at each stage of elections and more so on the day of counting.

The Chief Secretary emphasized on the extraordinary situation arising out of Covid-19 and the steps to be taken by the Districts in conducting elections as per the office order dated 12.1.2022 issued by the Special Relief Commissioner, Odisha based on the Covid guidelines of SEC in this regard.

The D.G. & I.G. of Police stated that this particular election provides a different kind of challenge where elections are to be held in a pandemic situation. Any slackness may aggravate the situation in hampering free and fair elections in the State.

Initially the meeting started with the discussion on the possible situations arising out of the Covid-19 and the corrective steps to be taken by the administration for conduct of safe elections in the State. ACS, Health & F.W. and Director, NHM gave inputs on the present situation in the State and the possible scenario in the future.

Discussions were held on protocols to be followed while allowing Covid +ve patients to vote and it was decided that by and large the protocols followed by the Election Commission of India will also be followed for the Panchayat elections in the State.

After a threadbare discussion where many Districts participated and gave their opinion it was decided that a committee may be constituted at the level of the Commission fine tune the Covid guidelines so as to hold the elections in a safe manner.

The 1st Session ended where the Chief Secretary and other Senior Officers of the State Government were allowed to leave and the 2nd Session began with DG & IG of Police and ADG, Law & Order.

Discussing the agenda-wise items the State Election Commissioner highlighted the following points: -

- (i) All Districts shall comply with the Commission's instructions on supplying printed copy of Electoral Roll to the eligible Political parties free of cost and others on payment of charges, if not already done.
- (ii) Adequate arrangements shall be done at the District and Block level for safe custody of ballot papers which will be received from the Govt. Press from 17th onwards.
- (iii) Submission of caste Certificate is mandatory for reserved post. The district Collector as the Chief Revenue Officer of the District Shall ensure that nobody is deprived of filing Nomination for non-availability of caste Certificate.
- (iv) Affidavit is required for all those contesting for Sarpanch, P.S. Member and a declaration by those contesting for the post of Ward Member. Furnishing false Affidavit is punishable as per the recent amendment and the affidavit and the Nomination papers submitted by the candidates contesting for ZP Member has to be hosted in the District Website.
- (v) Requirement of polling personnel and vehicle to be assessed and finalized at the earliest.
- (vi) Joint Master Plan by the collector and SP to be prepared and submitted to the commission by 28.01.2022.
- (vii) Strong Room to be in place at the District level and Block level as per the Odisha Treasury Code.
- (viii) Identification of sensitive and hyper sensitive booths to be furnished to the commission.
- (ix) Provision of CCTV and Videography to be worked out, subject to availability and approval of the Commission.
- (x) Strict enforcement of the Model Code of Conduct.
- (xi) Expenditure of the amount allotted as per the norms Prescribed by the Commission.
- (xii) Collectors on their return will immediately convene a meeting of all BDOs, Sub-collectors and other senior officers of the district who are to be associated with the conduct of the elections and will apprise them the intricate aspects of the election process.

Besides above the following issues were raised/resolved

- (i) The collectors were given the option either to engage videographer or CCTV coverage taking into account the availability at the district, cost thereof and suitability.
- (ii) Senior District Level Officers shall be deployed as Supervisory Officer above the Sector Officers and shall be kept in charge of each Block.
- (iii) Shifting of booths from one place to another is not permissible without the approval of the Commission.
- (iv) Adequate Police protection shall be provided at the Strong Room.
- (v) Districts shall cooperate with each other in making available the required number of vehicles/polling personnel from surplus Districts to deficit Districts.
- (vi) Strict vigil to be maintained on violation of Model Code of Conduct and action to be taken to check such violations.
- (vii) When information and reports are called for by the Commission, the same shall be promptly attended to.
- (viii) Observers will be appointed and they shall be provided with logistic support and secretarial assistance apart from their interaction with political parties when the meeting is conducted by the Collectors.
- (ix) All precautionary and preventive measures shall be taken to prevent any law and order situations.

The State Election Commissioner while summing up the important points discussed, advised all functionaries to efficiently perform their duties with impartiality and neutrality so as to conduct elections in a free, fair, peaceful and safe manner.

DG & IG of Police directed the Police Officer to rise to the occasion in this extraordinary situation and abide by the directions of the Commission for the smooth conduct of Panchayat Elections in the State.

ADG (Law & Order) also briefed the house regarding the scale of Law and Order arrangements to be made.

This issues with the approval of the State Election Commissioner.

Issue of directions by Chief Secretary.

Dear **Suresh**,

The State Election Commission has notified the detailed programme of General Elections to the 3 tier Panchayat Bodies in the State wide Notification Nos. 246, 260 and 274 dated 11.01.2022. With the issue of these statutory notifications, transfer of all Officers and staff who are actually or likely to be associated with the conduct of these elections are banned till the completion of the election process in all respects. The Code of Conduct prescribed by the Commission becomes operational and remains so till the completion of the election process. Certain provisions of the Code of Conduct regarding maintenance of strict neutrality are required to be observed by employees of the Government, PSUs, Local Bodies and Cooperatives during the election period.

2. It is customary for the Chief Secretary to **issue directions under his signature** to all Departments, Heads of Department, Revenue Divisional Commissioners and Collectors **imposing ban on transfers and requiring employees of Govt, and parastatal bodies to observe strict neutrality during elections and scrupulously implement the provisions of Code of Conduct** as are applicable to them. Accordingly, two draft letters are enclosed for issue under your signature for General Elections to Panchayats, 2022. While one draft relates to the **ban on transfer** of election related officials the other is regarding the **maintenance of strict neutrality** during the election process.

The circular letters may kindly be issued at the earliest. Copies of the letters may please be furnished to the Commission immediately after issue.

Madam /Sir,

I am directed to say that the State Election Commission has notified the programme of General Elections to the Panchayats (Gram Panchayats, Panchayat Samities and Zilla Parishads) vide Commission's Notification No. 246, 260 & 274 dated 11.01.2022. The Commission has directed that there should be a ban on transfer of Officers & Staff connected with the aforesaid election work.

2. The ban will apply to all Officers and Staff who are actually or likely to be associated with the conduct of the said Elections till 28.02.2022.
3. For the purpose of direct elections, Officers & Staff as listed in Annexure-I and for indirect elections Officers and staff as listed in Annexure—II come under the purview of the ban.
4. Leave of the officers connected with the conduct of elections shall not be allowed without reference to the State Election Commission.
5. Regular promotion shall not be made without approval of the Commission. Adhoc promotion and appointments at any level shall not be made in any Government office, Public Undertaking, Cooperative, Local Body & Panchayat Body during the period from 11.01.2022 to 28.02.2022. This will also cover contractual appointments and appointments through Service Providers.
6. There is also a ban on transfer of all other field staff during the period from 11.01.2022 to 28.02.2022.

7. The aforesaid instructions should be observed by you scrupulously and brought to the notice of all the subordinate offices under your control immediately for similar compliance.

Sub: Maintenance of strict neutrality by Govt. Officials during General Elections to Panchayats—2022

Madam /Sir,

I am directed to say that General Elections to Panchayats are scheduled to be held during February, 2022. It is of utmost importance that Government officials, including Police, at all levels should maintain strict neutrality in the discharge of their duties and do not act in any manner in the furtherance of the prospect of election of any particular candidate/ Party. The Panchayat laws of our State strictly prohibit any form of canvassing or influencing of election by an employee of the Government or local Authority and prescribe severe punishment such as termination of service for infringement. Section 28 of the Odisha Gram Panchayat Act, 1964 reads as follows.

"No person who is in the service of the State Government or of any local authority shall, by canvassing on behalf of any candidate or otherwise, interfere or any way use his influence in an election and a breach of the provisions of this section shall render the person liable to have his service terminated".

In this perspective, all employees of the Government, PSUs, Cooperatives and Local Bodies are required to ensure that their conduct is completely above board during the Panchayat Elections.

2. Official vehicles, machinery and personnel belonging to Government, PSUs, Cooperatives, Local Bodies and PRIs shall not be allowed to be used in electioneering work in any manner.
3. No advertisement should be allowed to be issued at the cost of the Public exchequer portraying the achievements of the Government until completion of elections in all respects.
4. It shall be the duty of the Police to ensure that complaints of criminal intimidation and violence and allegations relating to offences under Sections 153A, 153B, 171B, 171C, 171D, 171G, 171H and 505 of I.P.C are dealt with promptly, impartially and firmly.

5. The Code of Conduct prescribed by the State Election Commission, as applicable to the employees of the Government, PSUs, Cooperative, Local Bodies and PRIs shall be observed by them scrupulously till completion of elections to Panchayats.

Madam/Sir,


In inviting a reference to the subject cited above, I am directed to say that this Commission has fixed the ceiling for use of vehicles by the candidates contesting to different Offices in the Panchayat Election. Apart from the above the following guidelines are laid down to be observed by various Political Parties at the District level and State level on use of vehicles for the election to Zilla Parishad Member.

1. District: All the Political Parties (National Party, State Party, Registered unrecognized Party) may use vehicles for propaganda in support of their candidates. In Districts where the number of Zilla Parishad Constituencies is 20 or less, the Party can use one four wheeler/three wheeler and in District where the number of Zilla Parishad Constituencies is more than 20, the Party can use two four wheeler/three wheeler. The President of the District unit of the concerned party shall intimate the Collector in advance with the particulars of the vehicle to be used. The expenditure to be incurred in use of vehicles by the District unit shall be apportioned among the candidates sponsored by the Party in the District.
2. State: The Political Parties shall have to submit the list of star campaigners to the Commission and the expenditures to be incurred on the campaign by the State level Leaders shall be met out of the Party funds and to be shown in the IT Returns.

The vehicles to be used in transportation of election materials from the Party headquarters by the Party concerned shall have to be intimated in advance to the Commission as well as to the concerned Collector, so that they


are not held up on the way on the grounds of restriction on the use of vehicle. However, the use of such vehicles in the election campaign in the field in any district is strictly forbidden.


